Influenced by God

You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything except to be thrown out and trampled under people's feet.

Matthew 5:13 (ESV)

There are two foods that I love, but cannot eat unless they are salted. One is grits. The other is potatoes. Unless they are salted they taste bland. They have no flavor whatsoever. But season them with the right amount of salt (*and butter*) and both are delicious.

In the verse above from Matthew 5:13 Jesus tells us we are the salt of the earth. As Christians we are to add salt, read flavor, to the world around us. But not just any flavor—Godly flavor. Flavor influenced by our Heavenly Father. Imagine having a big ol' baked potato on which you put salt and butter, but when you tasted it, it didn't taste salted. The salt you used had lost it's saltiness. It was worthless. So are Christians who have lost their godly saltiness. Any flavoring we add to the world around us needs to

come from God the Holy Spirit who has gifted us to salt the world around us with the flavor of Jesus Christ.

That happens only as we are filled with the Holy Spirit and seeking to live our lives for Jesus Christ. It is only as He has influenced our lives for good, that we are then able to influence the lives of others for Christ. "When we think of influence, what often comes to mind is title and position, fame and fortune or status and authority. You may well have all or a few of these things and still not have influence."

Christian influence is God-given. It's a gift given by Christ Jesus through the Holy Spirit for the benefit of bringing about His will. God's will is that everyone come to faith in Jesus Christ (John 6:40). Our role as disciples is to influence the world around us with the love of Christ. We do this by using the four T's of influence: time, talents, treasure and testimony.



Matthew 5:13

Through our baptism we are called to unleash these gifts through the church and into the world. In Matthew 5:14-15 Jesus tells us: "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house." When we give to God of our time, talents, treasure and testimony, he takes them and influences us to use them for His glory.

God in turn, influences our use of our four T's to be an influence to others. All four T's are gifts from God, He expects us to be good stewards of them in order to bring glory to His holy name. In Matthew 5:16 Jesus tells us to *let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.*"

These words from Scripture and our Service of Holy Baptism remind us that we are to give ourselves to good works that God might use us to influence others with the Good News of Jesus Christ.



Concerns, Receptions and Approvals:

Council meeting minutes for August 9, 2020 were approved. August envelope offering was below budget \$21.90 with year to date above budget \$7.427.80. August income was below budget \$497.46 with year to date \$5,179.45 above budget. August expenses were under budget \$2,245.28. Year to date expenses under budget \$33,356.21. Cash on Hand as of August 30, 2020 was \$90,509.63. Contributions to Brighten the Beacon Fund in August were \$1,751.00.

The financials were approved as presented.

Reception of:

Pastor's Report for August 2020 was received with special notes of four children in First Communion Class who will receive their first communion on October 4th. It was also noted that Pauline Lyerly was our second member to die from complications with the COVID-19 virus.

Committee & Auxiliarv Reports:

- Stewardship: Cam Ritchie presented the proposed 2021 Budget. After discussion, a motion was made, seconded and approved to present the 2021 Budget to the congregation.
- **Property:** The LED up-lighting has been installed in the sanctuary as well as behind the stain glass Garden of Gethsemane. Worship: Word of thanks given to those who continue to make worship available in person and live streaming. Singing will resume next Sunday (September 20) with special note that everyone will sit and wear a mask while singing two verses of the selected hymns. Singing will possibly increase in October.
- **Evangelism**: The Loved Bible project is continuing. Four Bibles have been turned in and the deadline is September 27th. Blessing Bags are still available for distribution. David Preslar has contacted Rowan Helping Ministries for a delivery date during fall for the clothes collected during Lent. Upcoming events include Trunk-or-Treat which will be a drive-through concept. There will three different drop-offs which will include one station to hand out candy, children's literature and Christiana Church information; second station for a hotdog bag meal and the third station will be for a popcorn bag. We will still have the decorated trunks line up around the circle and will have judging on those. The Thanksgiving meal will be the same as last year. \$40.00 donations will be requested for a family meal. More information will be forthcoming in the October and November newsletters.
- Nehemiah Group: Motion was made, seconded and approved to install one camera with DVR capability outside the lobby entrance. Discussion will be held at a later date as to the possibility of installing additional cameras.
- Youth: Committee has met 2-3 times to plan opportunities for the Youth. The first event will be a pool party at the home of Jay & Karen Goodman on September 20th. All parents are encouraged to call Ann Teague this week for a head count if their children will be attending. Other outdoor activities that are being planned include a packing event at Rowan Helping Ministries, assisting with Trunk-or-Treat, Tombstone Scavenger Hunt and a Drive-in movie night.
- Brighten the Beacon: Committee will start meeting again soon. The committee is encouraging the congregation to continue with their donations/pledges.
- Facilities: Zelia Frick has donated a lighthouse photograph for the newly renovated Fellowship Hall. The photograph will be dedicated on September 20th.

LCW-Sister Lucille: Resumed meeting in September and discussed several new projects.

LCW-Miss Katherine Lyerly: Will resume in October. This group is collecting cans for the food pantry at RHM.

Prayerful Consideration of Council Matters:

- Financial Aid to Vicar Mwavu Ronald: Seminary student performing his internship in a very remote part of Uganda. He works with an Orthodox Lutheran Church and an orphanage. He walks 22 miles to seminary every week. He has two months left in seminary and needs funds to help pay for his books, food and medicine. A motion was made, seconded and approved to send \$600.00 from the Pastor Discretionary Fund to Vicar Mwavu Ronald.
- Sunday School Attendance: Discussion was held regarding the low Sunday School attendance for the past year. Over 100 people attend worship service, however, only a small percentage of these individuals attend Sunday School.
- Special Offering on September 20, 2020 for Joy Lutheran Church. Reverend Paulette McHugh of Joy Lutheran Church will be preaching on Homecoming Sunday on September 20, 2020. A motion was made, seconded and approved to take a special offering on Homecoming Sunday for her church. (Our Lenten offering was given to Joy Lutheran Church).

Mike Yarbrough, who is sanitizing the Sanctuary each week, will also be sanitizing the Fellowship Hall moving forward.
