Where's the Proof?



I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is like the working of his mighty strength, which he exerted in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every title that can be given, not only in the present age but also in the one to come. Ephesians 1:18-21

Ever wondered where the Easter Bunny came from? And how it became associated with the resurrection of Jesus? According to the University of Florida's Center for Children's Literature and Culture, the origin of the celebration — and the origin of the Easter Bunny — can be traced back to 13th-century, pre-Christian Germany, when people worshiped several gods and goddesses. The Teutonic deity Eostra (Easter?) was the goddess of spring and fertility, and feasts were held in her honor on the Vernal Equinox. Her symbol was the rabbit because of the animal's high reproduction rate. It became associated with Easter when the Roman Catholic Church became the dominant religion in Germany in the 15th century and took over many of the pagan beliefs. In 1680, the first story about a rabbit laying eggs and hiding them in a garden was published. This legend was brought to the United States in the 1700s, when German immigrants settled in Pennsylvania Dutch country.

The Easter Bunny is a myth, plain and simple. It has no business even being mentioned at Easter because 1) it's not true and 2) it has no salvific purpose. The whole point of Easter is to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus from the dead and to worship him for the hope of life he gives to all who believe in him. But how do we know that Jesus really rose from the dead? How do we know he's not just like the Easter Bunny a pagan myth? Let's look at Scripture.

In John 20:24ff, we read that when told by the other disciples that Jesus had risen from the dead and appeared to them, Thomas said, "Unless I place my hand in his side and touch the place where the nails pierced his hands, I will not believe." When Jesus did appear before him, Thomas exclaimed, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to Thomas, "Do you believe because you have seen me. Blessed are those who believe yet have not seen."

That's you and me. We believe and yet we have not seen the Risen Savior with our physical eyes. So how do we know He's alive? Where's the proof? It's in the difference Christ makes in our lives when He dwells within us. It is a reality that occurs when the Holy Spirit dwells within us through our faith in Christ Jesus.

The words to the refrain of the hymn "He Lives" by Alfred H. Ackley say it all: *'He lives, He lives, Christ Jesus lives today! He walks with me and talks with me A-long life's narrow way. He lives, He lives, salvation to impart! You ask me how I know He lives? He lives within my heart.''*

When Christ lives in your heart you know. There is no mistaking the incredible power that comes upon you by the Holy Spirit. In the passage above from Ephesians 1, Paul tells us it is God's "incomparably great power for us who believe". Paul tells us it is the same power that God used to raise Jesus from the dead. Can you imagine?! The same power used to raise Jesus is given to us to empower us to live our lives for Him! When we have that power there is no doubt that Jesus lives because He lives in us. And the difference He makes in our lives becomes proof to others that Christ is risen.

The works we do in Jesus' name—repenting of our sin, proclaiming the good news, feeding the hungry, helping the poor, comforting the lonely, welcoming the strangers, loving our enemies, etc. are proof He lives in us. These are signs of our faith, signs that our hearts have been enlightened and that we have the hope of eternal life. May God bless us all to be living proof that Jesus lives for the salvation of the world.

Council Minutes February 12, 2017 council meeting minutes were approved as submitted.

Financial Report The financial report for February, 2017 was presented and explained by Laurie Ritchie, Treasurer. The financial report was then approved as submitted.

Reception of:

- **Pastor's Report** Pastor Carl noted that the next special service in the Reformation 500 series of events will be held at Faith Lutheran Church on April 30th. Pastor Carl encouraged all council members to attend as representatives of Christiana. The Reformation 500 service that was recently held at St. Paul's Lutheran Church was very successful and had a very good attendance.
- Youth Director's Report Brittney Barnhardt, Youth Director, reported that the youth had a very good time in the mountains recently. She also reported on the "Thank You Jesus" signs that are being seen around the area. She presented a plan to buy these signs for \$8.00 and resell them for \$12.00 each as a fundraising project for Thrive. Both reports were then accepted as submitted.

Committee Reports & Auxiliary Concerns

Stewardship Committee Cam Ritchie, Chairman.

- 25th Anniversary Celebration \$900 that was spent on the 25th anniversary celebration for Pastor Carl and Cathy was not approved to be taken from any particular line item in the budget. A motion was made to specify that the \$900 would come from Undesignated Funds. The motion was seconded and passed.
- **Fundraising Events** A motion was made to allow the funds necessary to pay for a fundraising event (such as an after service dinner) to be taken from specific line items in the budget. This way, all of the funds raised by the event would go directly to the specific cause or event with no money having to be deducted to pay for the fundraiser. The motion was seconded and passed.
- **Mission Trip** Brittney reported that the upcoming mission trip has been fully paid for. She also stated that they have until May to get refunds if not all of the slots are filled.
- Christian Education Committee Dale Beaver, Chairman. An action plan for increasing Sunday school attendance was presented. See attached plan.
- **Property Committee** J. Wood, Council Representative. Presented Council with a printed report from Jason Smith, property committee chairman. J. reviewed the list of repairs and general maintenance items handled by the property committee since the last meeting. Brittney Barnhardt noted that the Wi-Fi in the fellowship hall needs to be fixed. Richard Crouch also asked council members to be sure to thank Jason Smith for all of the things he does to keep the church running. Jason is here almost every day working on something.
- Social Ministry Committee Banks Kluttz, Council Representative. Richard Crouch gave the report in Bank's absence. The social ministry is planning to serve supper at the homeless shelter on March 23rd and need volunteers to help. Anyone interested in helping should contact Richard Crouch.
- **Brighten the Beacon Committee** *Richard Crouch, Chairman*. Richard reported that the architect is currently working on plans for the new building and that the Building Committee will meet next Thursday to review these plans. The BTB committee is also working on new brochures that can be used when approaching foundations and other local organization to request funding.

- Smith Hall/Fellowship Hall Use Guidelines. Madeline and Vickie presented the Smith Assembly Hall use guidelines that they had been working on (see attached guidelines). The off-premises use of furniture was discussed. It was agreed that NO furnishings, including table and chairs, may be removed from the Church property to be used for any private or public use except that of the Church itself. Only the metal tables in the existing fellowship hall may be rented with prior council approval. NO furniture from the Smith Assembly Hall can be removed for off-property use or rented. Madeline will make the appropriate changes and send out corrected guidelines. A motion was made to approve these changes. The motion was seconded and passed.
- **In-Kind Donations.** Vickie presented the updated form for In-Kind Donations. Branson stated that we should not include the fair market value of the donation. The donor is responsible for filling in the dollar amount of the fair market value. For larger donations we should also use a letter instead of a card to acknowledge the donation. A question was raised as to the tax deductibility of the donation of services. Madeline will check with a CPA regarding this matter. A motion was made to approve the In-Kind donation guidelines. The motion was seconded and passed.
- **Brighten the Beacon.** The following church members were nominated to serve as Board Members for the In Faith Community Foundation: Madeline Zieverink, Chris Sease, Branson Pethel, and Ronnie Smith. Also included were two advisors: current Council President, Richard Crouch and previous Council President, Laurie Ritchie. A motion was made to approve these individuals to serve as board members. The motion was seconded and passed.
