



True Love

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. The is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets.

(Matthew 22:37-40)

February is LOVE month. Valentines Day is the 14th and is the day for lovers to spend money on those they love buying cards and chocolates and all kinds of crazy stuff associated with love to show how much they care. The marketing media plays it up, commercializing love like it does all the other holidays and guilt-tripping us in spending ridiculous amounts of money on things that will be thrown away or at least tucked away in a drawer or closet shelf. Such a big deal is made of Valentines Day that we feel terrible if we don't at least get our loved ones a card. And *if we care enough to send the very best*, it will be a Hallmark Card.

Pfft. This has nothing to do with true love. True love is sacrificial, the giving of one's life for loved ones. The Apostle Paul's definition of love from 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 shows us what true love is about. Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

This definition of love defines the love God has for us and calls for us to have for one another. This kind of love is not easy, it takes work and effort. That's why God commands us to do it. For the most part we don't have to be commanded to love our spouse, our parents, our children, our friends—that comes easy. But what about when it doesn't? What about loving those who don't love us? We are commanded to love them too. Jesus commands us in John 13:35: A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another.

We're to love others as Jesus has loved us. How has Jesus loved us? Sacrificially. In Romans 5:8 we read: ...but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. As Jesus has loved us, so we are to love one another. Like I said earlier, this is not an easy thing to do. Our old sinful nature doesn't want to do it at all. That's why in the waters of Holy Baptism God makes us new creations in Christ Jesus and gives us his Holy Spirit so that we can love one another as God commands us to.

Read 1 John 4:7-21. This passage is entitled "God is Love." In it John tells us about God's love for us and our love for God. He tells us in vs. 19 that *We love because God first loved us.* The fact that we humans can love at all is because God loved us first. Now how do we use this ability to love? Is it just in the giving of cards and trinkets, or is it in acts of understanding, compassion and caring for others as Christ commands us?

True love manifests itself in love for God and love for others. That's the Great Commandment Jesus tells us about in Matthew 22 (*see verses above*). And our Lord tells us that by keeping this commandment, we don't have to worry about fulfilling the Law and the Prophets because they're taken care of through love.

So this Valentine's Day, and all other days you want to show your love to others, show them you care by giving them the very best—Jesus Christ and his incredible, sacrificial love. Then invite them to experience God's love by coming to know Christ Jesus as Lord and Savior.



December 11, 2016 council minutes were approved as submitted.

Financial Report for December, 2016 was presented and explained by Dale Beaver, 2016 Treasurer. The financial report was then approved as submitted. Laurie Ritchie, the incoming treasurer, reported that all of the church financial information has been transferred to her.

Pastor and Youth Director Reports were accepted as submitted.

Prayerful Consideration of Council Matters

Committee Reports At all future council meeting, each committee chair or council rep will do a 1-2 minute report on their committee's activities and plans.

Stack's paid off loan for vehicle.

Marvin and Betty Weant's request to transfer from St. Johns to Christiana was approved.

The floor in the Peggy Boggs classroom has been taken repaired.

Assembly Hall Use Guidelines Vicki Keen and Madeline Zieverink will work together to review and come up with a final proposal for the Smith Assembly Hall use guidelines.

Cub Scout use of basement assembly hall after several minutes of discussion a motion was made to allow the cub scouts to use the Smith Assembly Hall for their first meeting of each month for their awards program. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Delegates for 2017 Harry Agner was asked to be a delegate for the next two years and accepted. A motion was made to appoint Harry as a delegate to represent Christiana at various church meetings. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

The health and wellness committee proposed purchasing an 8" picnic table and placing it outside the church near the water fountain. It would be made of wood wrapped in PVC and sit in an area approximately 10' by 10' with mulch for a base. The cost would be \$400 and would be paid for with money from a fundraising dinner. The exact date of this dinner will be determined at a later date. A motion was made to approve this project and fundraiser. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Brittney requested that all loose offering for the month of January be designated for Thrive. A motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously.

New house committee Council approved the formation of a new committee to be headed by J. Wood and Jim Duncan to explore the possible uses for the newly acquired property adjacent to the church.

Visitation Committee PC requested approval from council to organize a visitation committee. A motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously.

Constitution Committee Council authorized the formation of a new committee to review the existing church constitution and make any corrections or updates needed. This committee will be headed by Branson Pethel and Cam Ritchie and include other church members. A motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously.

Nursery Committee A motion was made to organize a nursery committee to work on revamping the nursery schedule and guidelines. Members of the committee would include Susan Holland, Katie Sease, and Wendy Hawkins. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Vickie Keene brought a request from the Brighten the Beacon committee to begin a loan pre-approval application with F&M Bank before the next phase of construction begins. This is not a loan application, only a pre-approval review to determine what the church could qualify for in the event the church decided to apply for a loan to finance the Beacon Center. This would not cost the church anything and there is no current talk of a loan, only that it could happen at a later date based on donations and pledges. A motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously.

The first four sessions will include a brief evening prayer service with 3-5 Lutheran hymns selected by the host congregation. Following the speaker's message, refreshments will be served as a fellowship opportunity.

The Joint Reformation Sunday event will include a full worship service with the Lord's Supper celebrated. There will be a combined choir from the participating congregations. Pr. Mark Ryman will provide the evening's message and refreshments will follow for additional fellowship.

Come worship with us for a laity refresher perspective on what the Reformation has meant to Lutheran Christians. A Nursery will be available for little children during each of the five services. Questions about these services may be directed to any of the four pastors serving as session speakers. This would be an excellent learning opportunity for everyone, especially confirmation students and new or prospective congregational members.
