Our Community:

We are located between the small towns of Granite Quarry & Rockwell on the outskirts of Salisbury. Salisbury is a small city located in Rowan County North Carolina about three miles away. It has been the county seat of Rowan County since 1753 when its territory extended to the Mississippi River. Located 25 miles northeast of Charlotte and within its metropolitan area, the town has attracted a growing population. With a 2023 population of **36,104**, it is the **28th** largest city in North Carolina and the **1,262nd** largest city in the United States. Salisbury is currently growing at a rate of 0.52% annually and its population has increased by 1.59% since the most recent census, which recorded a population of **35,540** in 2020. Spanning over 22 square miles, Salisbury has a population density of 1,620 people per square mile.

The median age in Salisbury is 36.4 years, 34.1 years for males, and 39.2 years for females.



Our mission and vision statement both describe Jesus being the central focus in our lives in everything we say and do. Trusting the Holy Spirit to guide, strengthen and encourage us with spreading the Gospel and meeting the needs of this world with a servant's heart.

What are the primary goals of your congregation?

Reaching out to the community where we live and worship to bring souls to Christ. We will accomplish this by:

- Continuing to grow and support our current outreach programs and look for additional opportunities to serve those in our community who are in need.
- Using our **new** pre-school as a community outreach opportunity. Start with being intentional about inviting the parents to worship services and other church events. Also, have kids' programs during Sunday service to introduce those families to our congregation.
- Updating and revising the Christiana brochure for church visitors, the veteran's group that meets weekly
 on our campus, preschool parents as well as our members for circulation and sharing with others about
 our work and ministries.
- Holding a "committee fair" to inform and educate members in an effort to increase active involvement in the life of the church.
- Encouraging members to be more intentional about greeting visitors and occasional attenders.
- Encouraging members moving where you sit in an effort to get to know other members better.
- At the weekly veterans' program/luncheon, of well over 100 veterans, distribute a church calendar of events and personally invite veterans to our Sunday worship service and events.
- Preschool give parents a copy of the church newsletter each month.
- Work to bring our weekly church attendance back up and beyond pre-covid levels.
- Grow our youth program by educating and encouraging whole family participation.

Worship:


LITURGY: Our congregational worship follows the format of the full liturgy. We celebrate Holy Communion on the first and third Sundays of each month and on all High Festival Sundays. We use various liturgies that are contemporary and traditional. We would define our service style as blended. We hold one 10:30 services that integrates both contemporary and traditional styles.

HYMNALS and HYMNS: We use the ELW red book for our hymns and sometimes print hymns in the bulletin from other sources. We enjoy different styles of hymns, so we have the copyright licenses that allow us to print directly from Song Select on CCLI and pretty much any hymnal published by Fortress Press.

MUSIC: Our organist/director of music holds a Masters' Degree in music education and is an accomplished keyboardist. She may play Bach on the organ for the prelude, and then the following week play a contemporary song on the Clavi nova. **O**ur choir is excellent and sings in four parts (SATB). Anthems often vary in style, from a full choir to solos to quartets. Special music is provided often, based on the theme and scriptures for that week. Cantatas are often presented for Easter or Christmas. All music is selected to lift up and amplify the central theme of the day, and to match the pastor's sermon message.

VESTMENTS & PARAMENTS: The pastor wears a robe with their chosen stole for the current church season. The chancel paraments are displayed according to the season as well.

ACOLYTES: Our youth serve as acolytes, receiving training and encouragement on the importance and significance of their roles in the service.



- Brighten the Beacon (2015-current): A capital campaign to create and/or improve our infrastructure to better facilitate outreach and ministry. Significant progress has been made.
- Preschool Program (2022): Moved our preschool from a third party to an in-house operation, led by our church.

CHRIST CENTERED


Everything we do at Christiana is about JESUS. Without our Lord & Savior Jesus Christ, Christiana Lutheran Church does not exist.


