Baby Bottle Campaign announced



When We All Get Together

(What a joyful day that will be!)

"And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

Hebrews 10:24-25

When are we going to get back together for worship at the church? This is a question a lot of us are asking. My answer would be when Governor Roy Cooper announces it is safe for us to do so. And his answer will be based on the recommendation of those in the medical profession who have determined that the COVID-19 virus is on the downside of infecting the population. Until then I recommend we continue on with doing things the way we currently are doing them—virtual Sunday School and worship.

As of this writing we have had only one member die of the virus—Carolyn Corl, who was a resident at The Citadel (formerly Genesis); and one member—Tony Hawkins, who contracted the virus and is fully recovered from it. To my knowledge, no other members have contracted the virus. And I believe that is because we are doing what the governor has mandated and are staying home and wearing masks when we go out and are washing our hands and disinfecting things we touch such as doorknobs, surfaces, mail, keys, cellphones, etc.

When we do get back together don't expect things to be the way they were. I'll be working with our executive committee and council to plan how this will happen. I'm thinking we will start with just worship and then as things prove safe we will add other activities. I see disinfectant wipes in all the bathrooms for people to wipe down toilet handles and seats after use, as well has faucet handles. I see bottles of hand sanitizer located throughout the building and every other pew taped off to practice physical distancing. I see encouraging the use of masks for those who want an added layer of protection.

We will continue to provide livestreaming worship on Facebook for those who don't feel comfortable gathering in the sanctuary just yet, as well as for those who are unable to come to worship at church. In the meantime I propose that we all stay safe and practice good hygiene to flatten the corona curve as quickly as possible. Continue to pray, read and study your Bible and live out your faith in word and deed.

The verses above from Hebrews tell us to consider ways to encourage one another to live our life in Christ. An important part of that is gathering together for Bible study and worship and doing good works. In this time of the coronavirus pandemic it is imperative that we continue to encourage one another to love and good works, and since we are prohibited from gathering together we will just have to be creative in how we do this.

We live in an age of technology and we can use these tools to stay in touch with one another: to call, video chat, message, twitter, email, social media, send pictures, video conference. The sky is the limit. So be creative. Stay in touch. Encourage family and friends to remain faithful and do all you can to stir one another to love and good works.

God is with us and will empower us to do his will under these circumstance. He will bless us for our efforts and cause them to bear fruit. The LORD bless you in the days ahead to stay steadfast in the faith, seeking to do that which is well pleasing in His sight, all the while anticipating the day when God will bring us back together for fellowship, study, worship and service.

Concerns, Receptions and Approvals:

Council meeting minutes of March 8, 2020 were approved as presented. Thank you to LaVaughn Beaver for taking and typing minutes.

March envelope offering was over budget \$2,756.67 with year to date above \$10,939.01.

March income was over budget \$3,364.94.

March expenses were over budget \$876.33.

Year to date expenses under budget \$13,641.16.

Spendable cash as of March 31, 2020 was \$84,795.29.

Contributions to Brighten the Beacon Fund in March were \$1,817.00.

Special notes for Financial Report:

A gas refund of \$421.00 was received.

A sales tax refund of \$1,219.92 was received.

The first loan repayment of \$1,700.00 was made to F&M on February 28, 2020.

The financials were approved as presented.

Reception of:

Pastors Report for March 2020 was received with special notes of the start of livestreaming the worship service on March 22nd and livestreaming Sunday School (Dale Beaver) on March 29th due to COVID-19. In addition, Becky and Harold Morris, Kathy Haynes and Joyce Cavanaugh-Wood have been helping lead the worship services along with Jason Smith operating the camera and Terry Ritchie running the sound board. Carolyn Corl is the first member of our congregation to die of the COVID-19 virus.

Committee & Auxiliary Reports:

Stewardship: A motion came from the Fellowship committee for approval to place the remaining funds from the Lenten Meals in a separate line item for Fellowship activities only. The motion was seconded and passed.

Property: Jason Smith and Kevan Barringer planted grass seed at the dogwood tree. A leaky faucet was repaired at the parsonage. Repairs are being discussed regarding the remaining wall damage from the removal of the bees.

Social Ministry: Food was provided and prepped for the evening meal on March 26, 2020 and the breakfast meal on March 27, 2020 at the homeless shelter. Due to the COVID-19 virus the meal was served by the employees at Rowan Helping Ministries.

Evangelism: The pictorial directory has been distributed and the phone app is available for the directory. Forty Days-Forty Items Lenten Challenge has stopped for the present time; however, Rowan Helping Ministries will be able to accept our donations at a later date. Blessing Bags are still available for the congregation to keep in their car and distribute to any homeless people they may encounter. Future items that are being considered is a favorite scripture devotional book and the Love Bible Project.

Fellowship: A thank you was given to everyone that assisted with the Lenten meal. Soft drinks have been provided for today's blood drive.

Landscape: A yard workday has been scheduled for May 2nd with lunch being provided.

Nehemiah Group: Continues to provide safety personnel while livestreaming services are being conducted. **Brighten the Beacon:** Table and chairs are being purchased for the Fellowship Hall with some of the designated Thrivent funds. A portion of the Thrivent funds will also go to the Pastors' Discretionary Fund.

SL: Members participated in a Food for Thought packing party at RHM on March 3, 2020. Provided the BtB meal on March 10, 2020 which included various soups, sandwiches, salads and dessert.

Prayerful Consideration of Council Matters:

The total cost for the removal of the bees was \$2,075.00. Estimates are being obtained for the repairs which will include replacing the sheetrock, painting and brick work.

The fire ants in the cemetery have been spot treated; however, they are still increasing in number. A quote of \$850.00 was obtained which includes a gel treatment to be administered as needed and includes a one year warranty. The Executive Committee was contacted regarding approval of this service and the cemetery was treated on April 18, 2020 with the funds coming from the cemetery fund.

A new phone tree system is needed for the office which will allow the messages to be sent to all members simultaneously and will free up the phone lines for Ann Teague. The new phone tree system can also be used for e-mails and text messages. This system can be accessed from any location other than the church which will be more convenient for sending out messages. The costs for the first year will not exceed the sum of \$600.00 and are being covered by an anonymous donor. A motion was made, seconded and approved for the use of this new phone tree system for the period of one year and to review the continuation in 12 months.

A camera was purchased (less than \$500.00) for livestreaming the worship services and Sunday School. A motion was made to take the funds from the Music and Worship Fund. After discussion, the motion was amended to take the funds from Undesignated Funds. The motion was seconded and passed.

A word of thanks was given to Jason Smith for providing the funeral meal for Lane Pethel.
