

Items of Business:

- Welcome to Banks Kluttz who will be filling the open seat on council for the remainder of this year and next.
- Update on Preschool: We are looking for a helper in the 4-year-old class. Had an increase in enrollment after the first week. Is receiving positive feedback from the parents thus far.
- Pastor Keith Less is a trained interim pastor who was recommended by our NALC District Leader pastor. He has certification in Lutheran transfer ministries and is looking for a church where he can serve as an intentional interim pastor for a church that has had a long serving pastor of fifteen years or more and is making the transition to call a new pastor. This is a process that needs to be intentional.
- An intentional interim pastor relies on congregational autonomy as far as what would be expected for his services as an interim. He would do shut in calls, hospital visits, and services at minimum. In planning his role in the church, he said that we would need to set goals that help us to transition as we would want to transition as well as guide us in our thinking.
- Part of his job as an intentional interim would be to have small group meetings to gain a varied perspective. He can also make suggestions on areas to change or consider adaptability based on his observations and interactions with us during his time as interim pastor. He could also be as active as we wanted him in other church events.
- The motion was made to offer him a \$70,000 salary for an intentional interim position at Christiana Lutheran Church to start as soon as possible. The motion was seconded. The council approved.
- The offer was made to Pastor Keith Less in the meeting and he accepted. Details for the contract will be set and ready for council review by the council meeting next Sunday.
