
It has been over a year now and counting since the Interim Prayer Team was organized. It is great when we meet together as a large group or small gathering.

Pastors Report: Pastor Keith- A little behind on shut in visits. Currently not having any members visiting the shut ins. Pastor Keith expressed the importance of this ministry by the members. Will be teaching Adult VBS. Continuing Monday Bible Study. Next Bible Study is Lamentations and then will be the Chosen Series. We will be learning Setting 10 in worship.

Church Office Administrator Committee: Cam Ritchie presented the progress on posting the Church Office Administrator position to the council. (Ann's Position) Pastor Keith suggested that part of the requirements include the candidate must be an active member of a church. The committee consists of Cam Ritchie, Madeline Zieverink, Vickie Agner-Keene. The position will be posted next week on Facebook with a "boost", Indeed, church website and the bulletin.

Call Committee: David Preslar gave the council an update on the progress of the Call Committee. The church's posting went up on June 9th. A letter was sent to all pastors with new additions of postings. There are 72 churches within the NALC currently seeking pastors. There are only 4 in North Carolina. Next step is to continue to pray for our new pastor. David reminded the council this is the hardest part of the process which is waiting. Pastor Carl was elected Dean for our region and he will not be supervising our Call process since he was the previous Pastor. Pastor Steven King will be our resource.

Stewardship Report: Preschool financials were reviewed. The current Credit card for Bus gas now has a \$10.00 monthly fee per gas card. These will be cancelled and we will get one credit card through F&M for the drivers. This will have \$1,000 limit. This will be used for gas, and repairs should the bus break down. Insurance rate renewal for the church were reviewed. Motion to donate \$500 to Gordon Conwell for scholarships in honor of Dr. Mary Havens retirement. Funds to come from the Pastors Discretionary Fund. There being no discussion it was passed. A letter was received from Epiphany Lutheran Church. They left current church which was an ELCA church and are having to start completely new. Motion was made seconded and passed to send \$250.00 from Pastors Discretionary Fund.

Richard has loaded and the profiles and they are available on Christiana's web page.

Steps after profiles are posted:

Pastor Shelly communicates with all pastors in the NALC to consider if they're interested with seeking a new calling.

This was completed on July 6th

Currently there are 72 NALC congregations seeking a new pastor.

42 of those churches are seeking full-time pastors

30 are seeking part-time pastors

Based on the document I received on 7/6, there are four vacancies in North Carolina.

Receive applications for potential pastors from Pastor Shelly.

Call committee screens applications for preliminary initial interviews.

Complete preliminary interviews and determine which pastors to conduct full interviews with.

Schedule and conduct interviews.

Be focused and continue to pray for those engaged in the call process that Christiana will locate the pastor God is calling to lead us.

David has been in contact with Pastor Shelly asking questions concerning expectation on next steps. This is the message below, with Pastor Shelly's responses.

Good morning!! Just wanted to check in to understand expectations moving forward.

1. Will we receive names as pastors apply, or will we get them at a certain time each week, month? Response: You will receive pastor profiles as pastors indicate to me, they are interested in serving your congregation. It will happen at no certain time in the month. But will occur as I receive the request and then I will forward the pastor's profile to you via email for your call committee to review and begin the interview process

- 2. Are new postings announced when they are loaded to the NALC website? How do we know if steps 11 and 12 have been completed (as indicated in the NALC Process Summary)? Response: New postings of vacancies are indicated in the monthly vacancy list that is emailed to all the NALC pastors. New postings are indicated in red print. David, you will be receiving your first vacancy list shortly since I will be updating it in this next week for distribution to all the pastors.
- 3. Is there a location on the website where I can check to see if there has been any interest in our church's pastor vacancy? Response: At this time, we are not able to check to see how many times your profile has been viewed.
- 4. Is there anything else we need to do at this point? Response: Your next step would be to gather your interview questions. And continue in daily prayer: personal, call committee, congregation members, and weekly worship.

Thanks to both of you for your continued guidance as we maneuver through this process to locate the pastor God is calling to Christiana!!

I have said this before, we are blessed and thankful to Jim and Linda Duncan for leading our prayer team. Also, we are thankful to the entire prayer team for the foundational work they have done and continue to do preparing our congregation for our new pastor! We ask that everyone be in prayer concerning this most important process. We discuss in every call committee meeting the importance of prayer in the Call process and the great job our prayer team continues to deliver.

Now we are in a period of waiting, seeking and trusting God to provide our next pastor. We don't know how long it will take, so we need to be patient remembering this will happen in God's time. Lord, we pray that you guide and direct us to our new pastor!
