

Youth:

Youth Committee will have a meeting late July to plan youth events for our youth over the next few months. The goal is to provide at least one event for our youth each month to keep them active during the transition. A calendar of these events will be provided to the congregation following the meeting.

Bus:

The softball league had some trouble with the belts on the bus. Scott Lowry tuned it up and it is back in service now.

Prayerful Considerations:

Transition Call Process Update: We are currently putting together a call committee. Pastor Reid wants to come meet with the council and the call committee next month to provide information. The Pastor Care and Transition Team (PCAT) team will set a date to come to the church and poll us to make a profile for us that will be used by the call committee in the search for a pastor. The mission district and NALC will be very supportive and active throughout the process.

Supply Pastor Plan Update: We will eventually hire an interim pastor for a period of time during the call process. Richard Crouch has spoken with a possible candidate who is booked to come on September 4th to preach. We will have a called council meeting after the service to discuss his potential as an interim.

Sound System Concern: We have had several complaints about not being able to hear in church and on Facebook live. We had previously planned to wait for a new pastor's input, but it has gotten progressively worse. After doing a diagnostic on it, there is not much left we can do with the system we have at this time. In order to improve the sound, we need to rework some of the speaker structuring to improve the experiences for both in-person and Facebook Live viewing. The suggestion is to begin investigating options for updating and choosing a system that is expandable. The council also encouraged requesting the input of the sound system operators prior to making any decisions about it. It is next focus on the Brighten the Beacon project list.

Facebook Live Team: We need someone who can head up the Facebook Live team. We now have to have a page editor/administrator to record the service and post it. We have a phone to do it with but will need someone to login on it. Tony Hawkins will work on solutions.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
