



Followers of Christ



"If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." Matthew 16:24 NRSV

PASTOR Christiana is an unusual name for a church. After I became pastor here I asked several of the older

tion? No one really knew except to say that the founding members wanted Christ in the name and came up with Christiana.

Doing research I discovered Christiana is Latin *and* Hispanic for Christian. I also learned that the name means "Followers of Christ." How appropriate! For that is what we are to be as Christians—*followers of Christ*. In Matthew 16:24, Mark 8:34 and Luke 9:23 Jesus himself tells us *'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.*"

While we may choose to follow Christ, it is Christ himself who sets the standards for what that means. And in the passage listed above we learn that being followers of Christ involves denying ourselves and taking up our cross.

As Christians we follow our Lord by imitating his life and obeying his commands. In Jesus' day, to take up the cross meant to carry your own cross to the place where you would be killed. Many Galileans had been killed that way by the Romans. Applied to us as disciples, it means we identify completely with Christ and his message, even if it means death. We are to deny our selfish desires to use our time and money our own way and to choose our own direction in life without regard to Christ. Following Christ is costly now, but in the long run, it is well worth the pain and effort.

People are willing to pay a high price for something they value. Is it any surprise that Jesus would demand this much commitment from his followers? And so Jesus gives us three conditions that must be met if we want to be his followers. We must be willing to deny self, to take up our crosses, and to follow him. Anything less is superficial lip service.

When Jesus called his original disciples he said to them, "Follow me." And numerous times in the Gospels it is recorded that "they got up and followed Jesus." As time went on they learned just what that meant. But by then, they realized who Jesus was and what he had come to do and they were "hooked." In fact, on one occasion when many of Jesus' disciples left him, he asked the twelve, "What about you, don't you want to leave also?" To which Peter replied, "Lord to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

Jesus does indeed have the words to eternal life. In fact Jesus is the life. He is also the way and the truth and no one receives eternal life without him. In John 10:27 Jesus tells us: *My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me.* As members of Christiana and disciples of our Lord Jesus, we have the unique opportunity to make a mighty witness of our Lord Jesus through our presence here in the East Rowan community.

Our commitment to the youth of this area is seen in our hiring a Youth Director who is working hard to teach our youth what it means to be followers of Christ so they can reach out and bring other youth to be followers of Christ. Our Thrive Tutoring Program is one way our youth and adults are reaching out to the youth of this area and minister to them through education.

Our Brighten the Beacon Capital Campaign program will afford us tools in the form of buildings, new and renovated, to enable us to invite the community onto our campus where we might share with them the Good News of Jesus Christ. But in order for us to make the most of these buildings we ourselves have to become knowledgeable in sharing our faith so that God can use us to make a difference in peoples' lives.

God has blessed us in the forms of godly leadership and committed disciples, let us dedicate our lives to the Lord and live up to our name "followers of Christ" in order that we might reach out to the East Rowan community and the whole world with the Good News that Jesus Christ is Savior and Lord.




