

True Love

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. The is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets.

(Matthew 22:37-40)

February is LOVE month. Valentines Day is the 14th and is the day for lovers to spend money on those they love buying cards and chocolates and all kinds of crazy stuff associated with love to show how much they care. The marketing media plays it up, commercializing love like it does all the other holidays and guilt-tripping us into spending ridiculous amounts of money on things that will be thrown away or at least tucked away in a drawer or closet shelf. Such a big deal is made of Valentines Day that we feel terrible if we don't at least get our loved ones a card. And *if we care enough to send the very best*, it will be a Hallmark Card.

Pfft! This has nothing to do with true love. True love is sacrificial, the giving of one's life for loved ones. The Apostle Paul's definition of love from 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 shows us what true love is about. Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

This definition of love defines the love God has for us *and* calls for us to have for one another. This kind of love is not easy, it takes work and effort. That's why God commands us to do it. For the most part we don't have to be commanded to love our spouse, our parents, our children, our friends—that comes easy. But what about when it doesn't? What about loving those who don't love us? We are commanded to love them too. Jesus commands us in John 13:35: *A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another.*

We're to love others as Jesus has loved us. How has Jesus loved us? Sacrificially. In Romans 5:8 we read: ...but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. As Jesus has loved us, so we are to love one another. Like I said earlier, this is not an easy thing to do. Our old sinful nature doesn't want to do it at all. That's why in the waters of Holy Baptism God makes us new creations in Christ Jesus and gives us his Holy Spirit so that we can love one another as God commands us to.

Read 1 John 4:7-21. This passage is entitled "God is Love." In it John tells us about God's love for us and our love for God. He tells us in vs. 19 that *We love because God first loved us*. The fact that we humans can love at all is because God loved us first. Now how do we use this ability to love? Is it just in the giving of cards and trinkets, or is it in acts of understanding, compassion and caring for others as Christ commands us?

True love manifests itself in love for God and love for others. That's the Great Commandment Jesus tells us about in Matthew 22 (see verses above). And our Lord tells us that by keeping this commandment, we don't have to worry about fulfilling the Law and the Prophets because they're taken care of through love.

So this Valentine's Day, and all other days you want to show your love to others, show them you care by giving them the very best—Jesus Christ and his incredible, sacrificial love. Then invite them to experience God's love by coming to know Christ Jesus as Lord and Savior.

Faith's role in love

In *It's Okay Not to Be Okay*, Christian author Sheila Walsh looks at the allencompassing love that Jesus expects of his followers. He commands us to "love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself" (Luke 10:27, ESV).

But we can't love that way without faith, Walsh writes. "I'm not living by faith if I have an answer to everything. If I understand everything God does or doesn't do, then all I need to love him with is my mind. We're called to love him with more." That "more," she explains, involves these paradoxes: "We love with all our heart,

even when it's broken. We love with our soul, even when our humanity wrestles against our situation. We love with our strength, even when it's almost gone. We love with our mind, even when we don't understand."

Even if God's purposes and plans don't make sense here on earth, we can heed this advice from the great preacher Charles Spurgeon: "When we cannot trace [God's] hand, we must trust his heart."


