STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

Remember the days of "paying it forward" when you went to McDonald's or another restaurant with a drive-through lane? You'd get to the window expecting to pay for your Big Mac, and the cashier would happily announce, "The guy in front of you already took care of your order." What a feeling that was! Someone you didn't even know paid for your lunch!

Then what did you do? The generosity you experienced became contagious! You wanted to get in on it, didn't you? So you paid for the person behind you in line, right? It was fun to see just how long that would go on—five cars, six cars— how long could we keep it up? Sometimes the cashier would tell you how many times it happened already and what number you were in that line of spontaneous giving.

This story shows us how contagious giving can be. When we see someone we trust giving joyfully, not worrying about what they might be parting with, but instead excited about what God is doing, we then see others giving in the same way. Generosity has a ripple effect. It is exciting! But most times we need to invite others to join us! We may be denying them the opportunity to share in our joy if we never mention what God is doing and how we can be a part of it.

Profile added to list of vacancies Start receiving applications, then schedule and conducting interviews with potential pastors seeking a calling at Christiana


During this time Ann continues to print and share the characteristics as: flyers in our weekly bulletins part of our weekly updates part of our monthly newsletter


