His Final Days

"Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures..."

Luke 24:45

After Jesus rose from the dead, what did he do? How did he spend his time? We know from the Gospel accounts of the first day that Jesus appeared to Mary Magdalene and some other women. We know he appeared to his disciples. We know he walked along the road to the village of Emmaus with Cleopas and another disciple. Twice in Luke's account it is recorded that Jesus opened the minds of the disciples to understand what was written about him in the Scriptures.

The Scriptures Jesus used to instruct his disciples were what today is our Old Testament. These Scriptures, Jesus taught, point to him as the promised messiah. With his teaching complete Jesus reassured his disciples that the Holy Spirit would cause them to remember all he had taught them and empower them to be powerful witnesses of his resurrection. Jesus then instructed them to wait in the city of Jerusalem until they were filled with the Holy Spirit.

In Matthew's and Mark's accounts Jesus commissions the disciple to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always to the end of the age."

Then, according to Luke's gospel account, Jesus led them out to Bethany and blessed them, and while he was doing so, he ascended into heaven. "The *disciples* worship *Jesus* and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and were continually in the temple blessing God."

In John's gospel account, even before he was crucified, Jesus told his disciples he would be going away, but he would be sending the Holy Spirit upon them so he could be with them all the time regardless of where they were. So it is no surprise that after Jesus ascended into heaven, the disciples went back to Jerusalem joyfully. And it is no surprise that they were continually in the temple blessing God—because they finally understood. While Jesus would not be with them physically, he would be with them spiritually. Their minds had been opened by Jesus to understand the Scriptures. What a blessing!

Our time together is growing short. After June 5th I will no longer be your pastor. But I have, over the past 30 years, sought through working with the Holy Spirit in my teaching and preaching, to open your minds to the Scriptures. It has always been my goal in ministry to preach and teach the truth of God's Word. God forgive me if I spoke or wrote anything that would mislead someone in the faith. My prayer for you is, that after I am gone, you will continue to read and study and teach and preach the Word of God to the disciples in this congregation, and to those outside this congregation as you seek to fulfill the Great Commission by making disciples.

I pray that you will continue to joyfully gather for worship weekly regardless of who is leading the service and preaching. Nothing would sadden me more than to hear that people have quit coming to worship because I'm not the one leading worship. We do not come to worship for the pastor, we come solely for Jesus Christ. Jesus is the one who died for us, who lives for us, who saves us, forgives us, renews us and leads us. He is the one who speaks to us through the worship leaders. He is the one who nourishes our souls through his Body and Blood in the bread and wine of Holy Communion.

Consequently, it is out of appreciation for all that Jesus does for us that we gather for worship, that we love him and one another, that we give our tithes of money, time and talents so that disciples are made, the needs of others served, and God is glorified.

I cannot begin to tell you how much each of you means to me. It has been a privilege and an honor to serve you as your pastor. Now, with my leaving, do not despair. Just as Jesus promised to be with his first disciples, he promises to be with you. He will guide and direct you as a congregation in the days ahead so that you are empowered to continue to serve him and make a mighty witness in his name.



Meeting: Called Church Congregational Meeting

Items of Business:

The meeting was called to order by Richard Crouch, President.

The congregation moved to waive the reading of the minutes from the last meeting.

The purpose of the called congregational meeting is to vote to approve the motion from Council to appropriate funds for the start-up of a new Christiana Preschool Program.

The director of the preschool has notified the church of her retirement. Laurie Ritchie has stepped up and offered to be the director of the program and to operate it as a ministry of the church that will include a Christian based curriculum.

She presented a program proposal plan to council that it will work as a non-profit preschool due to the fact that it will be a church ministry.

She requested that the preschool be added to the church liability insurance for up to \$1,200.00.

There will be a need to purchase supplies, curriculum, and equipment. Stacey (the previous director) offered to leave everything to the church for \$2,500.00.

She also requested council to appropriate \$3,000.00 to start-up costs.

She would like to have 3 members of the church to act as board members to help make decisions as needed.

A motion from council was made to approve a total of \$5,500.00 as start-up costs for the new Christiana preschool. It was seconded. The church approved it unanimously.

The meeting was concluded.
