

Called to order by Richard Crouch, President.

Moved to waive the reading of the minutes from the previous congregational meeting. It was seconded and passed. Purpose of the called congregational meeting is to vote to approve the motion from the Brighten the Beacon Committee that was approved by the council to spend \$14,982.06 from the Brighten the Beacon fund to replace the sound system with an updated system that includes a number of updates (refer to contract)

We will be leaving the sound system in the basement.

The contract will include some minor repairs as needed (refer to contract).

This new system will solve the Facebook feed, hearing issues, and other feedback sounds that distract during the service.

The organ will remain as it is because the system was checked and works fine.

Question: How will this affect downstairs and Sunday School system? There will be a new camera installed utilizing the existing computer and it will feed into the sound system.

Question: Will we have the ability to have personal receivers for people who are hard of hearing? We have that capability now and this will work with the new system.

Question: Will we be adding additional wireless mikes with this system? It is not included in part of this quote, but the system will be compatible with it.

Question: Will this be a complicated system with the new sound board, or will it be easy to use? Yes, the system will not be that different

Question: Will this new system allow for shut-ins to receive a copy of the service in a format other than Facebook? Yes, we will be able to duplicate and create DVDs and other formats.

Richard called for the vote and it passed unanimously.

With no further questions the meeting was concluded.
