# If You've had an Epiphany...



God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory.

Colossians 1:27

From the very beginning when God called Abraham and blessed him and promised to make a great nation of his descendants, God also promised that through him all the nations of the world would be blessed. (Gen. 12:3) Abraham's descendants would eventually become known as the People of Israel, God chosen people. But God did not choose them so that they could keep to themselves. God chose them to tell the nations about him.

Psalm 105:1 is just one of many verses that say: "Oh give thanks to the Lord; call upon his name; make known his deeds among the peoples." The people of Israel were to "make known" the Lord's deeds among all the peoples, but they failed to do so. Instead, they chose to keep God to themselves and unfortunately didn't do a very good job of that. For they rebelled against God and disobeyed his commandments.

The Scriptures prophesied of a messiah, one who would be the Savior of the whole world. Jesus is that messiah. But even when he was born, John tells us in 1:11 that "He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him." How sad. But we also know that God did not rely on the people of Israel to make known to the world the messiah. He used means of his own—such as a star.

Somehow, some way God made known to wise men by a special star that a king had been born. These men followed that star to a house in Bethlehem and found a toddler there about two years old named Jesus. They gave him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh and they worship him. These men were Gentiles, i.e. non-Jews. God had given them an Epiphany, he had made known to them, that Jesus was their King, their Savior, their Messiah.

King Herod, on the other hand, who was a Jew, saw in Jesus, not a Savior, but a threat. Consequently he sought to kill the child. Of course he was unsuccessful. Jesus was the King, but not in the sense that Herod thought. Jesus was not after Herod's earthly kingdom, he was after his soul. Even so, Jesus was still a threat to him.

The same is true today. Jesus is the King, the only Savior, the Way, the Truth and the Life and no one comes to God the Father except through him. (John 14:6) In John 1:12 we learn that all who do receive Jesus, who believe in his name, he gives the right to become children of God, who are born by the will of God.

Such people have had an *epiphany*, i.e. God has made known them the truth about his Son Jesus. If you've had an epiphany, and you believe in Jesus as your Lord and Savior, then he is no threat to you. You are like the Wise Men who came looking for Jesus, to give him gifts and to worship him. Those who do not believe are like King Herod and Jesus is very much a threat to them. And the reason is, as The King Jesus demands obedience and allegiance. He demands our all. The sinful human nature does not like that at all, it feels threatened.

We who know Christ as Lord are called to be *epiphanies* out in the world, making Jesus known to all people who come in contact with us. We dare not repeat the mistake of the Old Testament people of Israel and try to keep Jesus for ourselves. Jesus himself tells us in John 20:21: "As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." And in Matthew 28:19-20 we know that Jesus commands us to go into all the world and make disciples of all nations.

Thus it is our calling. It is our mission. It is our birthright. It's what we're suppose to do as Christians – share the good news of salvation by grace through faith in Jesus with the world. As we make him know to others through our words and deeds, God will be faithful to cause people to have an *epiphany*, to come to see clearly Jesus as Savior and Lord.

When we have perfect vision in our eyes we say our eyesight is 20/20. When we look back on something we missed and see what we did wrong, we say "Hindsight is always 20/20. Let's pray for God to give us 20/20 vision in our spiritual sight to see Jesus clearly and be able to proclaim him clearly to others. Let's make that our priority in the year 2020.



#### **Concerns, Receptions and Approvals**

It was reported by the Nehemiah Group that the Security Plan still has updates that are needed before the plan can be printed and shared with the congregation.

It was reported by the Nehemiah Group that the Fellowship Hall and the back door of the church bus have been left unlocked recently and present a security risk for the property. A security bar for the bus will be purchased and installed.

President Ritchie shared that the employee job descriptions have been updated with minor changes and he will meet with each employee by year end for a review of the changes and their job performance.

President Ritchie reported that the preschool agreement has been updated, reviewed and signed by the Directors. It was noted there has been no further contact from the individual who recently inquired about the purchase of the Old 80 property.

Interest in the availability of the Cub Pack trailer has been made by a church member and Cub Pack 351 at Faith Lutheran Church since the Christiana Cub Pack is no longer active. It was noted that the trailer was acquired by donation from another inactive Cub Pack. Council will request a recommendation from the Scout leaders to disburse of this property. The title for the trailer will need to be located.

Minutes for the Council and Congregational meeting on November 10, 2019 were approved as presented.

Financial reports as of November 30, 2019 were presented and explained by Laurie Ritchie.

November envelope offering was under budget \$785 with YTD envelope offering under budget \$4042

November expenses were under budget \$4595 with YTD expenses under budget \$12,691

Spendable cash as of November 30, 2019 was \$60,467.35

Contributions to Brighten the Beacon Fund in November were \$2918

\$2304 was collected from the November BtB meal and other donations for the steeple cleaning project.

Designated Fund balance Bus/Shelter funds have been fully repaid. \$5053 in additional funds collected was credited to BtB designated funds.

Fellowship Hall Construction Expenditures in November

Payment to Crescent Construction - \$97,022.43

Payment to A-1 Tree & Lawn - \$300

Loan origination fee paid to F&M Bank - \$375

The financials were approved as presented.

#### **Reception of:**

The Pastors Report for November was received as submitted. Pastor Haynes shared that the new Council members and officers will be installed on Sunday, December 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Committee and Auxiliary Reports**

**Stewardship:** The 2020 Fundraising schedule was shared with members. Approved additions to the calendar include: CLM Valentine Dinner – February 16<sup>th</sup> and offering for Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary on August 9<sup>th</sup> when Pastor Mary Havens will preach at Christiana.

58 pledge cards have been received to date: \$148,760 to the General Fund and \$37,376 to the BtB Fund It was noted that a draw from the F&M loan will likely happen in December. The projected monthly payment is approximately \$1700 if the full \$150,000 is accessed. Sufficient funds should be available for this payment based on pledged monies for 2020.

**Property:** It was noted the steeple cleaning went smoothly and the results are very good.

**Social Ministry:** Six angels remain on the tree at this time but are expected to be taken by the end of service today. Gifts must be returned by December 15<sup>th</sup> for delivery.

**Evangelism:** The final draft of the Pictorial Directory has been sent to production and is expected to be received in January. Devotions from the Advent booklet will be posted to Facebook daily.

**CRS:** 22 lbs. of canned items for Rowan Helping Ministries was collected at the covered dish meal on 12/5.

**Nehemiah Group:** Five members were CPR certified at the training provided on December 6<sup>th</sup>.
