Scholarships Available Through Christiana in 2023

The following scholarships are available through Christiana Congregation. Those interested in applying please note the requirements. Complete information about each scholarship and applications are available on the church website, www.christianalutheran.org. If you have any questions or if you need assistance in accessing the information, please contact either Brian Barringer, chairperson of the 2023 committee, or the church office.

Lena Bangle Lyerly Scholarship

Must be a Christiana Lutheran Church member that participates and attends Christiana Lutheran Church as school schedules allows.

Enrolled in a two or four year college/university.

Working toward a degree in Health or Christian Ed. and having accrued 12 or more credit hours in that school of study.

Brad Patrick Scholarship

Scholarship will be awarded to a Rowan-Salisbury Public High School Senior with a financial need to further their education.

Applications may be obtained in the Guidance Counselor's office in any Rowan County High School.

Hubert & Blanche Ritchie Scholarship High School (1)

Must be a participating and engaged member at Christiana Lutheran Church for the previous 24 months prior to the application deadline.

High school senior.

Enrolled full time in a two or four year college/university.

Hubert & Blanche Ritchie Scholarship College (2)

Must be a Christiana Lutheran Church member that participates and attends Christiana Lutheran Church as school schedules allow.

Full time college student

See full eligibility requirements on the church website.

All scholarship applications must be completed and returned to the church office by 12 noon on Friday, March 24, 2023. Any applications received after that date will not be considered. All applicants applying for scholarships must have an official transcript from the school sent to the church office. No others will be accepted. For those applying, and meeting scholarship requirements, check(s) will be made payable to the educational institution and the recipient awarded the scholarship only. This way we ensure the funds are going to support the student in their academic endeavors and not for miscellaneous or erroneous expenses.

Jesus answers our uncertainties

Thomas didn't believe the other disciples when they said Jesus had risen. The two travelers to Emmaus despaired over Jesus' death, uncertain what might come next.

During our life of faith, we all face questions, doubts and despair. In *Fearless*, Max Lucado says Jesus' responses to us echo his responses to the disciples. His answer to our doubt is the same as with Thomas: "Touch my body" — which we do every time we connect with the church (the body of Christ), wounds and all. As with the Emmaus disciples, Jesus urges us to ponder his story found in Scripture — which we do through Bible reading and study. Today, just as long ago, Jesus meets his followers — in his body, in his Word — and strengthens our faith.



“The name of the Lord is a strong tower; the righteous run into it and are safe”

Where do you go or who do you call when there is a problem or a crisis? The answer to that question says a lot about who or what you put your trust in. When my children were young and something upset or frightened them, they called my wife or myself. They trusted us to deal with whatever the problem was. As they got older the problems became more complex, but they still called us for advice or comfort depending on what was needed.

God as our Father is very engaged and willing to listen to our problems, hurts, and disappointments. Like most grown children, we try and handle things ourselves whenever we can with mixed results. We like to think we are in control and can manage just fine. However, that is not the relationship God fought for when He sent Jesus to cover our sins and re-forge the broken relationship between Himself and the world. He is an active participant in the lives of His children and is willing and able to guide and protect us. We must be willing to go to Him with our concerns and cares. The good news is that He can and does offer what He promises.

So, the question for us is, do we trust God enough to go to Him? It is a good question and one that should be considered often. Do I trust God in this? Do I really believe His promise of aid? Take some time during this Lenten season meditating on your relationship with God and just how comfortable you are with trusting Him in all things.
