Must be a Christiana Lutheran Church member that participates and attends Christiana Lutheran Church as school schedules allow.



2022 Report of the Council President

Christiana has been through many changes since Linda and I joined the church 19 years ago, but none more impactful than what we experienced in 2022.

It began in February when the long-time preschool director announced she was retiring in May. Seeing the need to make the school a *direct ministry* of Christiana, Laurie Ritchie offered to be the director and kicked off the brand-new Christiana Creative Preschool in August. Laurie updated the curriculum and created a fresh experience for the students by hiring an entirely new staff of devoted teachers and assistants. Laurie's vision for our new preschool is "to provide a unique educational experience designed to encourage and motivate children to learn in a loving Christian environment". Midway through its inaugural year, Christiana Creative Preschool is already an overwhelming success. The kids AND parents are loving the new environment and it's amazing to see how God is working at Christiana!

On June 4th Pastor Carl preached his final sermon at Christiana, and after the service, the church gave he and Kathy a wonderful retirement send-off with a beautiful reception brilliantly orchestrated by our many creative and talented ladies. The day was a bittersweet celebration of two people who meant so much to so many.

The next four months without a pastor was when I most appreciated the people of Christiana Lutheran Church. Many stepped up and took on new roles and jobs to help facilitate the worship services as well as make the church operations run as smoothly and efficiently as possible. It was amazing to experience the congregation coming together closer than ever before; loving and encouraging one another, staying positive and hopeful, filling the large gaps left by a 30-year pastor and his wife. It was beautiful to see the entire congregation placing their trust in God to lead us through this transition between pastors.

Each week there was a different supply pastor with a different personality and a different style. There were a number of weeks when a supply pastor was not available so one of our own would deliver the message. During the services when a little "snafu" occurred here and there, the congregation was so gracious, so sweet and understanding and that meant the world to me and to everyone involved. It was a challenging but rewarding time and I'm so thankful to our Lord & Savior and to all the members for your love and support during that time.

Becky Morris did a stellar job of keeping our worship services humming right along and kept things fresh with new songs, special nuances and events such as Patriotic Sunday. Ann Teague in the office was the glue holding the operational side of the church together. She took on many functions that PC did in terms of preparing each week for the worship service and keeping us all informed and linked so that very little fell between the cracks. I'm very grateful for these two ladies going above and beyond the call of duty. The very first thing we did after Pastor Carl's departure was form the Prayer Team. I asked Jim Duncan to head up this team and he and Linda immediately went to work recruiting members and creating a process for praying for our next pastor. The Prayer Team meets once a month and each member has a prayer partner

with whom they pray with weekly. The team members also take turns offering up the Intercessory Prayers during the worship services. Many thanks to Jim and Linda and to every person on the team for taking on such an instrumental role in seeking God's perfect will for Christiana.

In August, the Pastoral Call Committee was formed and is chaired by David Preslar. I'm very grateful to David and each person on his team for taking on this most important task. The other members are Brittney Ritchie, Dale Beaver, Jason Smith, Charlotte Pacilio and Cam Ritchie (I serve on the committee as ex officio). In October, the committee held a congregational workshop to inform and involve all members of the church. The workshop was very productive and ultimately produced the top 5 traits the congregation will see and recognize in the pastor God is sending us. The committee is in the process of creating our "congregational profile" which will be posted on the NALC website in the spring of 2023. For a pastor seeking a call, this will be their first glimpse into the life of Christiana.

Pastor Keith Less arrived on October 2nd to serve as Christiana's interim pastor. He came highly recommended by our mission district dean and upon arrival was greeted with three back-to-back-to back funerals which accelerated his connecting to the congregation. PK has been well received for bringing a comforting presence, fresh perspective and casual style to the members. He conducted mid-week Advent services in the Smith Hall and is starting a Bible study in January on the book of Revelation. Many thanks to Pastor Keith for being with us during this period of transition.

In December a new sound system was installed with Facebook cameras in the sanctuary and Smith Hall. This much needed upgrade will certainly enhance our worship experience however, because it's brand new technology, it will take little time to learn and tweak so your patience and understanding will be greatly appreciated in the meantime.

Reflecting back on 2022 and all the good that took place, I have so much for which I'm thankful. First and foremost, I thank God our Father for the strength and encouragement He gave me and each one of us as we embarked on this new chapter of Christiana Lutheran Church. I thank Him for each of you and for the ex citing plans He has for us. I'm thankful for our leadership who seeks to know God and do his will. I'm thankful for our former pastor, our current interim, and our next pastor—whoever that may be. I'm confident the Holy Spirit will reveal that person to all of us in His way and in His timing.

Thank you, Christiana, for your love and support last year. I love you all and hope you agree 2022 was a very exciting and rewarding year. I'm eager to see what God does through you and me in 2023.


