You can tell it's Lent....



"Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that God did through him in your midst, as you yourselves know—this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and fore-knowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it. Now when they heard this they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and

you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself." Acts 2:22-24, 37-39 (ESV)

You can tell it's the season of Lent as soon as you walk into the worship space at Christiana. You notice that there are no flowers adorning the Altar. The Paraments are purple. You can tell when the worship starts by the more somber tone of the music. No alleluias are sung either.

Lent is a time of reflection on what Jesus did for us on the cross. Jesus willingly and intentionally became one of us that he might show us the Father's love by dying on the cross to pay for our sins. Once we realize this, our reaction should be that of the Jews who asked the disciples upon hearing Peter's Pentecost sermon in Acts 2—"Brothers, what shall we do?" We repent. We repent of our sins each day because we sin each day. And God mercifully forgives us every time we ask for it. Do we deserve it? No! But God loves us so much that he will go to any length to make it possible for the likes of us sinners to have a relationship with him.

In the words of hymn 666: "What wondrous love is this, O my soul, O my soul! What wondrous love is this, O my soul! What wondrous love is this that caused the Lord of bliss to bear the dreadful curse for my soul, for my soul, to bear the dreadful curse for my soul?"

What wondrous love indeed! As Paul writes in Romans 5:6-8 For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die—but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Why would Christ, the Son of God, die such a horrible death for us sinners? For the ungodly? That's the million dollar question and the answer is simply this — "love." God the Father loves us. God the Son loves us. God the Holy Spirit loves us. And lest we take that notion for granted it behooves us to spend some time contemplating God's wondrous love. Hence, the season of Lent.

We began with Ash Wednesday and will continue for five Sundays contemplating our unworthiness because of our sin to be in a relationship with God; let us further contemplate God's incredible love for us that sent his only Son to die on a cross to pay for our sin; let us walk with our Lord to the cross on Holy Week that in the end we might celebrate with joy beyond measure our Lord's Resurrection from the dead on Easter Sunday.



Minutes of Feb. 11, 2018 Council Meeting

Concerns, Receptions and Approvals

The executive committee reported they had met with Tim Goodman, retired Senior US Probation Officer for the Western District of North Carolina to discuss the safety and security of the church property, members and visitors during worship and the normal course of activities during the week. Mr. Goodman provided an overview of the presentation he has made to other churches in our area from the standpoint of awareness and preparedness. As a next step, the executive committee made a recommendation that the church contract with the Rowan County Sheriff's Department to have a safety and security site assessment of the church campus performed by a deputy sheriff not to exceed a cost of \$200. The recommendation received unanimous approval.

January 6, 2018 council minutes were approved with one spelling correction.

Financial Report for January, 2018 was presented and explained by Laurie Ritchie, Treasurer.

January income and expenses were below budget. Items of note included:

January loose offering of \$253 went to the Youth Fund

Annual \$1800 meal payment received from Rufty Holmes

Payment of unbudgeted 2017 Rowan County tax bill for the Old 80 property. This is a one-time tax bill that will not reoccur.

Cost of new stage was \$204.27 under amount of funds donated. Council approved moving these funds to the building fund.

Pastor's Report for January

The pastor's report for January was presented and accepted as submitted.

Thrive Youth Report for January

The youth directors report was presented and accepted as submitted.

The youth director reported that four high school youth have signed the L.I.T. contract and will intentionally be in contact with younger members of THRIVE each month.

Prayerful Consideration of Council Matters

Stewardship Committee: Committee received a request from CLM to add the BBQ chicken fundraiser on 3/23 to the loose offering fundraiser which was approved by council.

Christian Ed: Committee met on 2/6/18 to begin planning for the year. To ensure the safety of children in the time between Sunday school and worship, the committee will work with teachers and parents to keep younger children in classrooms until a parent comes to pick them up and older children will not leave classrooms until the second bell rings. This will limit the time a child might be unattended while on church property. A dinner for Sunday school teachers is under consideration for addition communication and training before rally day later this year.

Property Committee: A report of maintenance items for January was received. The following items were noted:

The problems with running water in bathroom sinks did not occur in January after Jason had conversations about the problems with various people in the church. The automatic cutoff faucets approved for purchase have not been installed in part because they are not compatible with the existing sinks; new sinks would need to be purchased and because there have been no new incidents with running water recently.

A request was made to repair and rehang the eternal candle that broke in January.

A request was made by Charlotte Pacilio on behalf of the quilting group to move the stage pieces out of the room off Smith Hall which had been approved for the quilters use.

Social Ministry: Winter items (hats, scarves, and gloves) were delivered to Rowan Helping Ministries. \$341 was collected at Souper Bowl Sunday on February 4th.

Worship Committee: Committee held its first meeting to make plans for the year. A request from the memorial fund is planned to replace the altar cloth due to damage from dripping candle wax over the years. Options were discussed for restoration of the ledge where altar flowers are placed including refinishing and/or glass installation. It was recommended that Altar Guild purchase candle lighter adapters that would replace the 'wicks' presently used in the brass candle lighters.

Evangelism Committee: Lenten Devotionals have been distributed and Tony Hawkins will be posting the devotions daily on the Christiana Facebook page. A discussion was held regarding the use of Facebook for advertising church activities and events. A PayPal account would need to be opened with a credit card linked for payment of the events, activities and outreach such as the Lenten Devotions that are 'boosted' outside of those following the Christiana Facebook page. This can be done at a very reasonable charge. A motion was made by Terry Ritchie and seconded by Pastor Haynes as follows: Allow Tony Hawkins to serve in the role of 'advertiser' with permission to establish a PayPal account for the Christiana Facebook page. Ann Teague's credit card will be attached to the PayPal account. Written guidelines will be created for requesting an advertisement such as; VBS, Men's Car Show, etc. by committee chairs' not to exceed 10% of the committee's line item budget without council approval. Tony will provide a monthly report of any advertising activity for payment and accounting purposes. The motion was unanimously approved.

Fellowship Committee: The Pancake Supper is Tuesday night from 5:30 - 7:30 pm in the Fellowship Hall. Lenten meals have been planned. Volunteer groups are needed to provide Brighten the Beacon meals in March and April. The meal in May will be provided by the Sister Lucille Circle. The meals will resume in September after a summer break from June - August.

Archives Committee: Have not met - transitioning to new leadership

Scout Committee: Today is Scout Sunday with Scouts participating in the worship service and providing lunch afterwards. A request to sell popcorn at the luncheon was approved by affirmation.

Health Committee: Requested approval for storage area for first aid kit and designated area in archive room for someone who is ill to go for assistance or wait for emergency responders.

A cabinet in the archive room was approved for this purpose. Committee will need to locate a key for access as the cabinet is currently locked.

Brighten the Beacon Committee: The committee met on 1/25/18 to determine a recommendation for council as requested. Richard Crouch provided a summary of events through June 2017 and subsequent conversations with Ronnie Smith by committee members and Cam Ritchie. The following motion was presented by the committee: *The June 2017 postponed congregational meeting be rescheduled for the earliest possible date, at which time the Beacon Center design and funding package - as originally approved by council be presented to the congregation for a vote.* The motion passed with three dissenting votes. Cam Richie will pursue additional details for the funding option from the Smith Family Foundation for the meeting. Sue Wall asked that each council member be in prayer about where we are today and the next steps to be taken for this ministry. The executive committee will work with the BtB committee to coordinate the best option to present the information and selecting a date for the congregational meeting.

Bus Committee: A presentation from the bus committee was tabled until the next council meeting due to time constraints.
