"The Lord opened my unbelieving eyes" in Ireland, Patrick later said. God led him back there, and he converted tribe after tribe to Christianity.



In Confessio 61, St. Patrick writes, "I testify in truth and in great joy of heart before God and his holy angels that I never had any other reason for returning to that nation ... except the Gospel and God's promises."

#### Lena Bangle Lyerly Scholarship

Must be a Christiana Lutheran Church member that participates and attends Christiana Lutheran Church as school schedules allows.

## Pastors Through the Years

This year Christiana celebrates 150 years of existence. The "History of the Lutheran Church in North Carolina" records the church as being organized on January 23, 1871 in the home of Nathan Brown. It began with seven charter members and was organized by Rev. Simeon Scherer, who was pastor of Union Lutheran Church at the time. He served both congregation for 3 months until Rev. R.L. Brown took

over on March 25, 1871. He served for 13 years.

Christiana and Union were a parish together and served by the following pastors: Rev. R.L. Brown, Rev. J.M. Hedrick, Rev. J. W Strickler, Rev. J. Q. Wertz, Rev. C.A. Brown, Rev. J.P. Miller, Rev. N. D. Bodie, Rev. L.B. Spracher, Rev. J. A. Linn, Rev. R.R. Sowers. During this time three seminarian students served the two congregations for a few months each: Harry Yarger, J.L. Morgan (who later became a pastor and President of the NC Synod ULCA) and B.E. Petrea.

In 1914 Rev. N.D. Bodie returned to serve Christiana a second time and was the pastor of Christiana for just four years. The Rev. C.B. Miller took over in 1919 and was the supply pastor for two years. Next Christiana called Rev, H.W. Jeffcoat who served only one year. Then the congregation was served by student E. R. Lineberger for four months. Rev. H.A. Trexler served 6 years, followed by Rev. G.W. McClanahan who served seven years. Rev. White Iddings served 6 years, followed by Rev. Paul Kinney, followed by Rev. Gilmer Boggs, followed by Rev. G.A. Phillips, followed by Rev. Franklin Dorton. Rev. Harold Rhoads served as Vice-Pastor for six months until Rev. Bill Hall was called in 1970. He served for six years. Rev. Herman Fisher was the interim pastor from August 1976 until mid April 1977. Rev. Don Safrit was called and began serving in April 1977. Pastor Safrit served for fourteen years. Then Rev. White Iddings returned to serve as interim pastor from May 1991 until December 1991. In January 1992, I began my ministry as your pastor.

Rev. Kinney was pastor when the white framed building burned in March 1945 and he was pastor when the new building was dedicated April 17, 1949.

In her 150 years of existence Christiana has been served by 27 pastors and three seminarians. Of the pastors one, Rev. N.D. Bodie, was called to serve as pastor on two occasions: 1903-1907 and 1914-1918. Pastor White Iddings also served twice—once as pastor from 1938-1943 and once as interim pastor from May 1991—December 1991. Rev. Iddings and his wife Pauline are both buried in our cemetery.

Only three pastors served into double digits in their time of ministry. Rev. R.L. Brown served for 13 years. Rev. Don Safrit served for 14 years, and to date I have been blessed to serve you for 29 years. In between Rev. Brown and Rev. Safrit, the pastors served between one and seven years.

God has blessed Christiana with faithful pastors who served Him through her 150 year history and we trust Him to be faithful to bless her with faithful pastors in the years to come.


