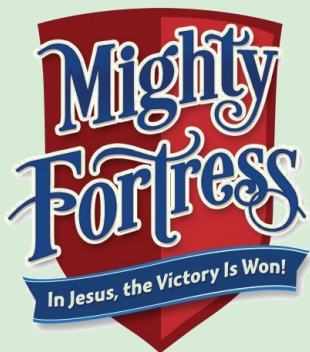

Summer Bible Reading TRIP for 2017

*I will study your commandments and reflect on your ways.
I will delight in your decrees and not forget your word.*
Psalm 119:15-16 (NLT)

This summer the Evangelism Committee is sponsoring a Bible Reading Challenge. It goes like this: for 65 days from June 1 to August 31, excluding Saturdays and Sundays, you are challenged to read the first six books of the New Testament: Matthew through Romans. That's 133 chapters which comes to two chapters a day and three chapters the last two days.

We want to have some fun with this, so to make it interesting let's see if more women than men can complete this challenge, and let's see if more youth 1st through 5th grade than youth 6th through 12th grade can complete this challenge. Parents/grandparents of younger children, you can read it to them.

I would love to see 100% of worshipers take on the challenge. When you sign up you will receive a check list of the books and chapters to read. There are further instruction listed on the check list which I have put below:

Road Map:

Summertime is when a lot of people go on trips. You are invited to go on a trip with me (Pastor Carl), as together we read the first six books of the New Testament. The excitement comes from looking in the daily reading for verses that God reveals to you what he wants you to know and do. Martin Luther used the word TRIP to help him study the Bible.

- T** – think of passage of scripture (*in this case the daily reading*)
- R** – record one or two verses on paper that have special meaning
- I** – in your own words write it out – noting how God spoke to you
- P** – what's my plan of action to apply this verse to my life

More fun in numbers: Find one or two other people to go on this TRIP with God with you. Share your adventures with members of the congregation when you gather on Sundays for Sunday School and Worship. God wants us to talk about his Word amongst ourselves.

Pick a translation of the Bible, your favorite or one you have never read from before, and begin reading on June 1st. Read Monday through Friday. You have Saturdays and Sundays off to read the Scripture lessons for Sunday. Get a notebook to make notes of your reading each day. If you read more than the assigned first six books of the New Testament, record your extra readings as well. We will celebrate the results September 11th.

Now the point of this is to get you into reading and meditating on God's Word, if you are not already doing so. As disciples of Jesus Christ we want to know Him and speak with him, and one of the best ways to do that is through His Word. We read it and meditate on it, we spend time reflecting on what it says, to us, what Jesus is saying to us. We open our hearts to the Holy Spirit and what He will reveal to us in God's Word. The result is a closer relationship with God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit; and a deeper understanding of how He wants us to live our lives.

I know I said earlier we want to have so fun with this by seeing which groups can have the most readers, but the truth is if you participate in this, we will all be winners because we will all grow in our knowledge of God's Word and our faith in Him and that is what it is all about!
