Property:

Social Ministry:

Served the meal at the homeless shelter on the evening of May 26th and breakfast the morning of May 27th. Baby bottled campaign ends next Sunday on Father's Day.

Fellowship:

Met and made pasta salad for the Pastor's retirement reception.

LCW - SL Group:

Motion: Proposed sponsoring a blessings box which would have essentials (food, books, etc.) for anyone to come by and get what they need as an outreach ministry. Jay Goodman would build it and the women's group would keep it stocked. This will need to be placed so it can be monitored via the outdoor camera. Council approved the motion with the goal of reviewing it frequently.

Supply Pastors/Lay Leaders Calendar/Christiana Ministry Transition Teams:

- Council received the calendar which has a pastor or plan for a lay leader coverage through the beginning of September.
- Laurie Ritchie is also coordinating a list of members to do the children sermons.
- The Duncan's have also started a prayer team that meets on Wednesdays to lead our search for a pastor and seek guidance during this transition. This group will reach out to church members as need and they will also lead the prayer section of the worship service.
- Becky Morris is working to coordinate a support group who will be present with members of the congregation when going through medical issues, personal challenges, and deaths in the family. Make sure to keep Ann updated of anything needs you know of for our congregation so this group can provide support.
- Christiana Creative Preschool Update: Currently cleaning out the rooms. Met with the all the teachers and only short an assistant for the 3-year-old class. Enrollment is enough at this time to cover the salaries.
- **Christiana Biography:** This came from the ELCA and stops in 2004. It is a very detailed account of the church history. We need a church member to continue that history with details. Laura Ritchie and Jason Smith will head that process.
- **Teacher Support:** Council proposed doing a noisy offering during the month of July to purchase gift cards for teachers in our congregation for back to school supplies.


