Committee Reports:

Stewardship:

Will meet Monday, August 15th to prepare the budget for next year. If anyone has a request to change their budget, they need to make it prior to the meeting.

Social Ministry:

Baby Bottle campaign was overly successful at more than \$2,411.00 for Life Choices Rowan. Will be serving at the homeless shelter in September.

Evangelism:

Finishing the Anxious for Nothing Devotional Booklet. Plan to publish them as a daily email or a week of messages.

Have a scheduled meeting this week on Aug. 18th to plan for the Trunk or Treat and the Thanksgiving Meal.

Membership Review:

Attendance has been good.

We have had between one to three visitors each Sunday.

Ann brought to our attention the fact that there are quite a few people who have not met the requirements for being considered an active member (give regularly, communion once a year). This will become important as we move into our Pastor calling process. A notification was placed in the bulletin for today and in the newsletter for the month.

Brighten the Beacon:

The sound system is on the plan to be the next thing on the agenda for improvement.

We have contacted two different companies who stated that repairs would mean waiting for the parts. It would be possible to replace the whole system quicker but that would require a meeting to review the costs.

Laurie Ritchie will plan a meeting for the Brighten the Beacon Committee to discuss next steps on this.

LCW - SL Group:

Had the pool party a LaVaughn Beaver's home.

LCW - MKL Group:

Donated 274 pounds of food to Rowan Helping Ministries.

Provided desserts for the Veteran's meals.

Made desserts for the DAR district meeting.

Decorated the men's restroom in the fellowship hall.

- Donated \$100.00 to Gordon Conwell-for a lifetime membership in honor of Louise Crowther, the group's woman of the year.
- Provided two pedestal arrangements on LCW Sunday and a floral arrangement for the Smith Assembly Hall.
- Coordinated the collection of Noisy Offerings during July and thanks to the congregation's generosity (over \$911.00 collected), Charlotte was able to purchase gift cards for our four public school teachers and two homeschool families.
- Sent a \$200.00 donation to Samaritan's Purse designated for Kentucky flood relief.
- Sent birthday/thinking of you cards to shut-ins.

Working to put together twenty school supply bags for children at the Family Crisis Council-Battered Women's Shelter. They are also planning to purchase underwear for women and children at the shelters as that is an immediate need.

Plan to purchase needed items (body wash, razors, and detergent) for selected veterans.

CRS:

July 12th met at Faith Soda Shop for dinner. August 9th met at Cracker Barrel with 10 members present.

Youth:

Youth Committee has planned one event for our youth each month to keep them active during the transition. The events will be sent to Ann to add to the monthly calendar and Laura Ritchie will announce it to the congregation to let them know when they are coming up.

All youth will be invited (youth 5th grade and lower will require family chaperones)

Each event will include a devotion/lesson, community service focus, and fun activity.

We will request volunteer adult helpers from the congregation for each event as needed.

Prayerful Considerations:

Quilting Guild: They make quilts for the veterans and donate them at no cost to them. Between the materials it costs roughly about \$400.00 a quilt. They do their own fundraising every couple of months. They would like to move to one fundraiser a year and they are requesting use of the Fellowship Hall on October 6-7, 2023. They also want to use it for the 2nd Monday of the month to have their sit and sew. The council made a motion to allow them to use the fellowship hall and not charge them. The motion was seconded. Council approved.

- **Request for Cubbies from Preschool:** We do not have enough cubbies for all of the three and two yearolds. Received a quote to get them built for \$540.00 and the company will donate the second one. The recommendation was to take it from Unbudgeted Funds. Council made the motion and it was seconded. Council approved.
- **Horseshoe Pits:** Dale wants to construct horseshoe pits behind the fellowship hall that will be donated by the Beaver family. They will help maintain the pits as long as they use the fellowship hall for their family reunions. Council made a motion to approve and seconded it. Council approved.
- **Tony Hawkins' Council resignation:** Resigned from council. Richard Crouch has made contact with Tony to discuss his decision and encourage him to remain a part of the council. Tony continued with his resignation. We will need to elect a person to replace him for the rest of his term through January2023. Richard will make a recommendation to the council for approval.
- **Mission District Dean Meeting:** This meeting will take place on August 18th at 7:00 p.m. with the council and the call committee members to discuss the pastor call process.
- **Possible Interim Pastor:** On September 4th Pastor Keith Less, who is trained interim pastor who is writing a handbook on how to train interim pastors for the NALC is coming to preach. For an interim pastor, normally the church contracts with them anywhere from 6 months to 2 years. Richard would like to have a called council meeting, including a light lunch, following the church service to discuss Pr. Less's possible service as our interim pastor.
- **2023** Council Nominating Committee: The outgoing council members are the nominating committee and need to start contacting possible nominees. The outgoing council members are Eddie, Earlene, Laura, Robbie, & Jason. Plan to bring a list of nominees to the October council meeting. Richard to send out list of ineligible members.
- **Project Light:** Made a request to increase their copying limit from 80 to 150 a month. Council made the motion and seconded it. Council approved.

September Lock-Up, Devotions, & Closing Prayer: Month of August is Kevin Barringer.

Next council meeting: **Sunday, September 11th at 8:00 a.m.** There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.


