A Heart of Wisdom

So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom.

Psalm 90:12



How long will you live? Who knows? God. Psalm 90:10 gives us an approximate number of years we can expect to be here on earth—70 to 80 years. But we don't know. The age spectrum in the obituary of the Salisbury Post is all over the place. As of this writing (Sept. 28) the youngest age was 54 and the oldest was 101. In between were folks who lived to their 60's, 70's, 80's and 90's. So since we don't know how long we're going to live, Scripture says it behooves us to number our days, that is make the most of the time we have here on earth.

What does that mean? For some folks it means acquiring the finer things in life: a good job, a big salary, a huge bank account, nice cars, etc. For others it means taking care of one's body, eating right, exercising, getting enough

rest, doing everything possible to de-stress one's life. But guess what? In either case the people will eventually die.

Years ago Schlitz beer had a commercial that said, "You only go around once in life, so go for the gusto!" That's rather fatalistic in my opinion. So you go for the gusto, then you die, then what? You have a great life here on earth, but then spend eternity in hell—that's no good!

Psalm 111:10 says: "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom..." So to get a heart of wisdom begins with fearing the Lord, not in the sense of being afraid of Him, but in being in awe of Him. God loves us and cares for us more than we will ever know, and He wants a relationship with us. That's why He sent His only Son to die on a cross to pay for our sin. Wisdom knows this and is appreciative to God for this gracious gift and desires to live one's life for God. In doing so we truly "go for the gusto!" in this life. Jesus tells us in John 10:10 "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly."

In Jesus, and Him alone, can we, do we have abundant life. In this life it means we have Christ with us until the end of our days here on earth, and then we are with Him for all eternity. But while we are here we will want to live our lives for God pleasing Him, worshipping Him, serving Him, telling others about Him. In doing so we will come to see that we have *got our heart of wisdom*.

Proposed Changes to Christiana's Constitution announced

The congregation council approved a recommendation from the Stewardship Committee for two changes to our constitution. The first change is in the Continuing Resolutions, Article 1 regarding Committees. 1.6 Stewardship Committee, the 5th sentence, change the word "audits" to "review. "It shall also provide for annual audits reviews of the accounts of the treasurers and the financial secretary, if there be one, as well as of the accounts of the schools and organizations within the congregation." The reason for this is financial. A true audit of our books, according to CPAs, would cost in excess of \$15,000. A review of the books, only several hundred. We have for years been conducting a "review." This change to the constitution will put us in compliance with what we are actually doing.

The second change is to Chapter 10 of the Constitution regarding Congregational meetings. The proposed change is to add the words "or email" to the two places in C10.03. "Notice of all meetings of this congregation shall be given at the services of worship on the preceding two consecutive Sundays and by mail or email to all voting members at least 10 days in advance of the date of the meeting. The posting of such notice in the regular mail, with the regular postage affixed or paid, or email sent to the last known address of such members shall be sufficient."

These changes will be voted on and ratified by said vote at our Annual Congregational meeting on November 14, 2021, at 10:20am in the Sanctuary. They were presented to the Congregational Council at its regular meeting in August and will be mailed to the congregation 30 days prior to the meeting in November. This is in accordance with the Constitution, Chapter 17. Amendments. C17.01.

New items needed for a new time capsule

How long will Christiana continue to exist? We've been around for 150 years so far. Can we make it to our 200th Anniversary? Maybe. Hopefully. Depends. On what? On how faithful we are in making disciples. Unless we make disciples, unless the next generation comes to faith in Jesus and makes disciples, the future could be dim. On the other hand if we are diligent and faithful to bring the next generation on board and

reach out to the community making disciples of all ages, the future will be very bright.



At our Homecoming in September, the contents of a time capsule that had been placed in behind the cornerstone sometime between 1947 and 1949, were displayed in the Fellowship Hall for folks to view during lunch. Many of the contents were in very poor condition. The Bible was so fragile that when one tried to open it, the pages disintegrated. But among the materials that did survive were a list of members who were a part of the Luther League (youth group). Many of them are still members and are in their 70s, 80s and 90s!

We want to place some of those items back in a new time capsule along with new ones provided by you. So if you have items of interest connected to Christiana Lutheran Church, bring them to the church on Reformation Sunday, October 31st. We will collect them, view them and then place them in vacuum sealed bags and place them in a large plastic tub. The tub will be placed under the Pulpit with a plaque mounted on the base of the pulpit telling of the Time capsule and how to get to it. It is to be opened on the 200th Anniversary of the congregation.

August Meeting Minutes: Approved

Treasurers Report: Approved.

August Envelope Income was above budget: \$1,622.29 Total August Income was above budget: \$1,167.26 YTD Envelope was below budget: \$1,127.70 YTD Total Income is below budget: \$3,574.11 August total expense was under budget: \$1,160.83 YTD total expense was under budget: \$36,833.01

It was discussed that we should change the terminology from "audit" to "review" of the books in the church constitution so it would not be so expensive to conduct each year. This proposal will go to the Congregation for approval.

Efforts to reach out to parents and problem solve have been made and were not successful in the long-term.

Brainstormed ideas but and unsure how to move forward. We will pray about this.

Property:

The small church sign needs bulbs and hinges = To be discussed at the brighten the beacon meeting. Ant treatment was done everywhere around the exterior of the church.

Evangelism:

Trunk or Treat coming up on October 30th. We will need funding for hotdogs and candy.

Items of Business:

Called to order by Jason Smith, President

Moved to waive the reading of the minutes from last meeting

Purpose of the called congregational meeting is to combine the Wi-Fi setup to a single, campus wide internet access

Cost of this will be a max of \$7,500

Goals include: the elimination of two different internet services to help reduce fees

Brantley spoke to notify the congregation: the main concern is that we get very strong passwords, one for guests, one for members, and one for administration personnel. He also stated that it was pricey

Jason responded with the plan to use a security plan that includes IP specific identification for Wi-Fi usage. It will have a multi-firewall system. The one that the office uses is blocked and not available for public use.

Spectrum does offer this service and can install it for cheaper initially, but fees associated with equipment rental would eventually outweigh the difference in price.

Jason asked for any other questions or comments.

Executive council met and decided to vote via show of hands due to COVID-19 protocols.

The motion passed unanimously by show of hands.
