If the Lord Wills

Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go into such and such a town and spend a year there and trade and make a profit"—¹⁴ yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes. ¹⁵ Instead you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we will live and do this or that." ¹⁶ As it is, you boast in your arrogance. All such boasting is evil. ¹⁷ So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin. James 4:13-17 (ESV)

This September is full of uncertainties. Just when we thought we could get back to some semblance of order in August, the COVID Delta variant reared its ugly head and on August 22 we closed worship to in person worship and had it live on Facebook only. As I am writing this article, it's uncertain whether or not we will worship in person on August 29th. And who knows what the month of September will bring?

Already the number of students and staff testing positive for COVID in our schools is up and getting worse. Hospitals in our area are almost at capacity with COVID patients. The Pfizer vaccine has been approved by the FDA. Is mandatory vaccination around the corner? Will we soon be back to mandated mask wearing? What about restaurants and other places of business? Who knows? God.

In the Scripture passage above James writes about the sin of human certainty. He reminds us that we are but *a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes.* We make plans all the time to do thus and so as if our time is guaranteed. Truth of the matter is, it is not. Only God knows for sure how much time we have here on earth. James' advice is for us to have the frame of mind that says: *If the Lord wills, we will live and do this or that.*

Kathy and I have a beach trip planned. Will we get to take it? God knows. Will we as a congregation be able to remain open and worship in person? Will we get to have homecoming and have Bishop Dan Selbo with us? Will we continue to have Sunday School? Will public and private schools be able to remain open to in class learning? Will businesses continue to operate normally? We hope so, but we're not sure. God knows.

The sad part about this pandemic and its surging variant is the arrogance of a lot of people. People are divided on the issue of masks and the vaccines. Each boasting in their position. James tells us *All such boasting is evil*. The truth of the matter is that as Christians we need to be seeking the will and mind of Christ in all this, so that we do what's best, not only for ourselves, but for others as well.

Paul advises us in Philippians 2:3-4 *Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others.*

God's will for us during this time of pandemic is to put the needs of others before our own. And Paul uses as his example our Lord Jesus who set aside his need to remain in heaven, with our need for the forgiveness of our sins. We need to do whatever is necessary to keep ourselves and others safe from COVID. If we refuse, risking infecting ourselves and others, we are sinning against our self and our neighbor. James says in verse 17: *So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin.*

We knew on Saturday, August 21 that we had three members who tested positive for COVID and those three members had been in close contact with other members of the congregation. The right thing to do was to call off in person worship on Sunday. It would have been sin for us in leadership to say nothing and hold in person worship exposing more people to the virus.

As this COVID variant surges and spreads, I want to encourage all of us to do what we can to keep safe and to keep from spreading it. Get vaccinated, (It has the FDA's approval!) wear a mask, stay apart from one another out in public. If you're not willing to be vaccinated and wear a mask, then stay away from folks. Better yet, if things continue to get worse, stay at home. This is good advice for all of us. If we're not going to be a part of the solution, let's at least not be a part of the problem.

Since only God knows the future, let's do what we can to help insure a brighter today for everyone.

Committee Reports:

Stewardship:

- Instead of using the term "audit" which is used in the Constitution the Stewardship committee wants to make a motion to change it to a "review" that is conducted by the treasurer and another member of the church (can change as needed). Council seconded the motion. It will now go to the congregation to vote on the official change.
- The motion was made to change the wording in the constitution to state that you have to be notified 10 days before the meeting via 1st class mail or via email instead of just mail. It will continue to be printed in the bulletin two weeks prior to the meeting.

Any committee chairs needs to contact Cam Ritchie or Jason with requests for funding prior to the budget meeting.

Security system has been installed. New iPads for the security team.

- Still need internet in the new fellowship hall. After getting several quotes the best price was \$7,050 to get campus wide internet using wireless routers throughout. Would mean that we could go to one internet provider instead of two which would save on average \$150.00 a month.
- A motion was made and approved to move forward with this offer using the funds from the Building Fund. This will go to the congregation for final approval.
- The police department recommended that we post signage that this is a Certified Safe Place which is monitored. A general consensus to post this information in the newsletter.

Constitutional Amendment

The following amendment to Christiana Lutheran Church's Constitution comes from the Congregation Council for passing. According to our constitution **Chapter 17. AMENDMENTS C17.01.** A 30 days notice is to be given by the Council of any amendment to its constitution. Notice is hereby given that at our annual meeting to be held at 10:20am in the Sanctuary on November 14, 2021, we will vote on the following Amendment to its constitution and by-laws:

Amendment: C10.03. Notice of all meetings of this congregation shall be given at the services of worship on the preceding two consecutive Sundays and by mail or email to all voting members at least 10 days in advance of the date of the meeting. The posting of such notice in the regular mail, with the regular postage affixed or paid, or by email sent to the last known address of such members shall be sufficient.

By-laws: 3.4 Notice of Meetings. Written or printed notice stating the place, day, and hour of any meeting of members shall be delivered, either personally or by mail **or email**, to each member as set out in the Church Constitution in Chapter 10, Congregation Meeting. (C10.03).

When our constitution was originally written, emailing information to people was not an option. Now it is a viable way of communication. Here at Christiana we email newsletters, contribution records, bulletins and weekly updates, saving us a lot of money in postage. The council feels it is a good thing to add to this list notices of congregational meetings whether annual or called, as well as letters to the congregation of other matters.


