One Call Now

On Coming Together



Our church leadership has decided to try coming back to the church for worship, *but with precautions*. If it does not work out, we will go back to livestreaming only. The following are guidelines meant to protect us and keep us safe while we're gathered together.

Come to worship only if you feel good and do not have a fever or cough. Please be considerate of others' comfort level and wear a mask. If you do not have one, we will have one for you. Tammy Hill has been busy making masks to fit men, women, and children. Each mask will be sealed in a baggie for you to pick up.

Please practice physical distancing. Doors will be opened 20 minutes before worship starts at 10:30am. Greeters will be outside, weather permitting. Doors will be open so you won't have to touch the knob to enter. An usher will direct you on going inside. Get a mask from the usher if you need one. Go to a pew and sit where there is a bulletin. Full size pews will have three bulletins spaced out, shorter pews, two. Obviously spouses can sit together as can whole families on one pew. When we reach 60 people in the sanctuary, worshippers will be directed to the Balcony and then to the Smith Assembly Hall where they can worship via livestream in front of two tv's there. Chairs will be spaced apart and bulletins placed on them.

We will not have a nursery for now and there will be no Children's Sermon Part 2. I will have a Children's Sermon, but the children will remain in their pew with their parents. At the Offertory, worshippers will come forward, one side at a time, and place their offering in the basket on the steps.

We will celebrate the Festival of Pentecost on this Sunday. That means we will administer Holy Communion. Pastor and assistant will use hand sanitizer before administering the sacrament and we will be wearing masks. After the choir has communed, worshippers will be invited to receive the sacrament from the pastor and an assistant. We will serve one side of the congregation at a time. Take you mask off to receive communion and then put it back on. I will hold a wafer before you and you will take it from the top. You will take your cup from the tray yourself. The cups will be spaced in every other hole so you will not touch another cup. Place your empty cup in the basket. Children may come forward for a blessing, but I will not be placing my hand on their heads.

Please keep in mind what this sacrament is—the Body and Blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ—and it is given for the forgiveness of our sins. Luther says where there is forgiveness there is life and salvation. This is consistent with Jesus calling this sacrament the "New Covenant" in His blood. So, believing this, we confidently receive the sacrament believing that Jesus' body and blood grant forgiveness and healing for our souls.

After worship please practice physical distancing. If the weather is nice go outside and enjoy fellowshipping there. I have missed you and look forward to seeing you on Sunday, May 31. The plan will be to continue to gather until there is a reason not to. Be in prayer that all will go well this Sunday.

A few more FYI's: The inside of the worship building: Sanctuary, choir room, robe rooms, bathrooms, Pastor's Study, Smith Assembly Hall, Kitchen, Nursery, all will be sanitized. There will be disinfectant wipes in the bathroom. Use them and throw them away. **DO NOT FLUSH THEM DOWN THE TOILET!!!** There will also be hand sanitizer for you to use upon entering the building. Please use it. And again, if you do not feel comfortable gathering for worship, *please stay home* and worship using your bulletin and livestreaming us on Facebook.



Concerns, Receptions and Approvals:

Council meeting minutes of April 19, 2020 were approved with an amendment that the funds used for the purchase of the camera for livestreaming the worship services and Sunday School was taken from Unbudgeted Funds and not Undesignated Funds.

April envelope offering was under budget \$1,370.37 with year to date above \$9,568.64.

April income was under budget \$1,895.38 with year to date \$9,232.88 above budget.

April expenses were under budget \$6,494.93.

Year to date expenses under budget \$20,151.09.

Spendable cash as of April 30, 2020 was \$87,799.94.

Contributions to Brighten the Beacon Fund in April were \$6,579.00 with the majority from memorials for Carolyn Corl and Ann Carscaddon.

The financials were approved as presented.

Pastors Report for April 2020 was received with special notes of the death of Carolyn Corl and Ann Carscaddon.

Committee & Auxiliary Reports:

Stewardship: Trunk-or-Treat expenses went over budget by \$1,613.36 due to a shortfall of contributions for the event. It was recommended by the committee to transfer this amount from the general fund in order to zero out this item on the balance sheet. A motion was made, seconded and approved to take \$1,613.36 from the general fund to pay these expenses. A discussion will take place at the next budget meeting to determine if a new line item is needed for the annual Trunk-or-Treat event.

Evangelism: A zoom meeting will be scheduled to discuss the next few projects.

Landscape: A yard workday was held on May 2nd. Bushes were planted while existing bushes and shrubs (including the cemetery) were trimmed. Two loads of mulch were delivered and spread on the playground. The cost for each load was \$315.00 and the men's' group and women's' group will each be responsible for payment of one load.

Nehemiah Group: Continues to provide safety personnel while livestreaming services are being conducted. **Brighten the Beacon:** Waiting on delivery of tables and chairs for the Fellowship Hall.

Prayerful Consideration of Council Matters:

A church reopening plan is being prepared. The first possible worship service could be Sunday in the Grove which is scheduled for May 24th. Tammy Hill is making fabric masks for those that may need one and Michael Yarbrough is in the process of obtaining wipes and hand sanitizer for use at the church. All detailed information pertaining to the reopening will be mailed in letter form to all members.

Several estimates have been obtained for the repairs from the bee damage and all damage will be repaired prior to reopening of the church for access to the balcony.

We have been approved! At the end of April the NALC Executive Committee met and decided that we are ready to be a full member congregation of the NALC! We are awaiting official documentation and instructions on next steps in the process, but this is a HUGE joy.

Worship services and gatherings at Joy continue to be offered via Facebook live, with audio recordings published to our website. We offer a weekly Bible study and Coffee and Fellowship on Zoom, as well as others opportunities whenever possible. We will continue to livestream indefinitely and Zoom until it is safe for everyone to return to fellowship in person.

Plans are underway to resume in-person worship for those at lowest risk of complications from COVID exposure. We will, of course, wait until our governor has lifted the 10-person gathering guideline and will be implementing a number of safety procedures to ensure that worship will be as safe as it can be.

Our new parish administrator, Scheri Force, has completed the first phase of training and is eager to learn more and to help in any way. We are delighted to have her on board. Our prayer ministers continue to serve diligently and meet monthly via Zoom. Others are also checking on one another, with a particular concern for those who live alone or have existing health issues. It is really cool to see people connecting so intentionally and encouraging one another in this difficult time.

We have asked folks to make donations of goods and money, in addition to our regular Ministry of the Month gift, as Mission Lexington continues to serve the community. They are currently in need of paper goods, personal hygiene items, and pet food. They receive donations at 216 Harmon Street Lexington Monday-Friday from 10am to 1pm.

Meeting was called to order by Jason Smith, President.

A recommendation from the Stewardship Committee was made to consider and approve an online giving platform with Vanco as an additional method for member giving. Various points of this program are:

• The platform will provide members with the option of making their church tithe via credit card, debit card or ACH payment.

• The member will create an online account with Vanco in order to make individual payments or set up auto-payments weekly, monthly or any interval that's best for the member.

• Can also be used for memorials, honorariums, fundraisers, as well as other church giving opportunities.

• The cost to the church is 30 cents per transaction plus a 1% fee when a debit card or ACH payment is made, and between 1-3% for a credit card payment with the exact rate depending on the type of card. There's also a \$20.00 monthly fee which will come from unbudgeted funds. There are no fees to the member participants.

• A record of giving is available from Vanco for the church and the individual members.

Tutorials are available online at Vanco for those interested.

The objective of the program is to give members an option which might be more convenient to some for making their regular tithe as well as other giving to the church. The online platform could encourage more consistent giving and be especially helpful to those members who live or work out of town and are not able to attend services regularly but still desire to give to the church on a regular basis.

A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the recommendation from the Stewardship Committee to implement the Vanco Online Giving Program with the fees to be paid from unbudgeted funds, and to evaluate the program's feasibility in six months but not make a decision as to whether to continue or discontinue until a year.

Council briefly discussed the Covid-19 safety guidelines proposed by the executive committee for resuming in-person worship services beginning Sunday, May 31. It was agreed to move forward with the recommendations and communicate the guidelines to the congregation.
