#### A Great Month!

November is one of my favorite months of the year. I love how it begins and ends and begins anew the Church Year Calendar. We begin with All Saints Sunday and remember that in Jesus Christ all who believe in Him are saints of God. We don't have to have any special blessing or proclamation; by virtue of our baptism into Christ we belong to God. We are holy, for whatever belongs to God is holy.

We are saved by grace through faith and we have hope of eternal life. For this reason we give thanks and praise to God that our loved ones, dear departed saints, are with Him and know perfect joy, peace and happiness. In the midst of our tears we remember them, thank God for the privilege of loving them while they were here on earth and rejoice in the fact that one day we will see them again and be with them for all eternity.

The last Sunday in the Church Year comes in November. It is Christ the King Sunday. We end this cycle of the life of Christ proclaiming Him King. He is *our* King to be sure; but He is also everyone's King whether they acknowledge Him as such now or not. One day they will.

The Apostle Paul writes in Philippians 2:11-13: Therefore God has highly exalted Him and bestowed on Him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

We who believe in Jesus as our Lord and Savior are called to plant the seed of His gospel with people we come in contact with that through the spoken Word the Holy Spirit might bring them to faith in Jesus. Then they can join us in rejoicing and giving thanks to God.

Thanksgiving Day, USA usually follows Christ the King Sunday on that Thursday. While a national holiday, it is a clear reminder to us Christians that all of our life is to be lived in giving thanks to God. In fact what more do we have to be thankful for than the fact that Jesus Christ is King. Because He is King, our lives are taken care of, both now and for all eternity. That is God's promise to all who believe in Christ as King, Lord and Savior.

November ends with the beginning of a new Church Year. The First Sunday in Advent we start anew, celebrating the life of our Lord Jesus. We begin by preparing our hearts to celebrate His coming into the world as one of us—God with us, Immanuel—the prophet Isaiah proclaims. (7:14) We remember our Lord's incarnation from John 1:14 *And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.* 

Jesus has already been born a human. He has already grown up, had His ministry, suffered and died, rose again and ascended into heaven. One day he will return. Of that day, Jesus tells, know one knows the day or the hour, except the Father.

In the last chapter of the last book of the Bible, Revelation, Jesus announces: *Behold, I am coming soon, bring-ing my recompense with me, to repay each one for what he has done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end.* 

And so in the season of Advent we focus on being prepared for Christ's Second Coming. We celebrate His First Coming, without which there could be no Second Coming, but we prepare our hearts to be ready for whenever He may return, and we tell others, so that they might be prepared too!

November is a great month!

## **Concerns, Receptions and Approvals**

September 11, 2016 council minutes were approved as submitted.

Financial Report for September, 2016 was presented and explained by Dale Beaver, Treasurer. The financial report was then approved as submitted.

Pastor and Youth Director Reports were accepted as submitted.

### **Prayerful Consideration of Council Matters**

#### **Brighten the Beacon**

Richard Crouch, Chairman of the Brighten the Beacon committee, reported on the results of the recent congregation poll. The poll results showed that the outdoor pavilion came in first with the new fellowship hall a close second. Renovations to the classroom building came in a distant third. Since there was no clear mandate for a particular project, it was decided to have another poll. This time a new option will be added for the congregation to consider.

The new option involves building a combination outdoor pavilion/fellowship hall in the location of the proposed new fellowship hall. The project would be built in three phases starting out as an open air outdoor pavilion and ending up as the fellowship hall that was initially proposed in the Master Plan.

After discussing the new option, Council voted to send out a new poll to the congregation along with having a presentation and luncheon on October 23<sup>rd</sup> to show the congregation this new option. The youth will prepare and serve the luncheon and a voting deadline of October 30<sup>th</sup> was set. Madeline Zieverink informed Council that the New Life Bible Class has taken on a new community service project for the Christmas holiday and asked for Council's support. The project involves raising funds for The Family Crisis Center's Holiday Wish List project. It was proposed that the loose offering for the months of October and November be designated for this project. A motion was made and passed unanimously.

## **Columbarium Update**

As part of the new columbarium project Council asked the Cemetery Committee to come up with a price list that would show the prices for plots, opening and closing of graves and columbarium niches. It was proposed that the prices for the columbarium niches be kept the same as the prices for grave plots.

#### **Property Committee Report**

Jason Smith reported that the cost to clean the gutters on the church would be between \$350 and \$900. A motion was made and passed to have Graham Roofing clean the gutters.


